Top-Ranked Pirates Blank No. 9 Augusta State, 9-0

SAVANNAH, Ga. - The top-ranked and defending NCAA Division II national champion Armstrong Atlantic State University men's tennis team blanked No. 9-ranked Augusta State University, 9-0, in Peach Belt Conference action on Thursday afternoon at Bacon Park.

Both teams advanced to the NCAA Division II's semifinals last year, but the Pirates (4-0, 3-0 PBC) easily handled the Jaguars (2-6, 1-2 PBC) in this year's regular season matchup. Augusta State has now dropped five straight, four against DII ranked teams and one DI match.

Armstrong took a quick 3-0 lead after doubles, giving up just five games in the three matches. The duo of **Jaan Kononov** and **Matus Mydla** blanked Maxime Coulomb and Kenneth Guy Mooney, 8-0, at No. 3 doubles, then the top-ranked doubles duo of **Daniel Regan** and **Georgi Rumenov** bested the No. 11-ranked duo of Victor Cabellos and Victor Guimaraes, 8-1, at No. 1 doubles. The No. 9-ranked duo of **Sven Lalic** and **Pedro Scocuglia** completed the doubles sweep with an 8-4 win over Romain Brunie and Jan Labas at No. 2 doubles.

The Pirates then won all six singles matches in straight sets to complete the victory. Top-ranked Rumenov began with a 6-0, 6-0 win over Cabellos at No. 1 singles, then **Pablo Gor** registered a 6-0, 6-0 win over Gustav Anderson at No. 6 singles. No. 14-ranked Regan followed with a 6-0, 6-3 win over Guimaraes at No. 3 singles.

No. 22-ranked Scocuglia beat Gustavo D'Ascenzi, 6-2, 6-1, at No. 5 singles and No. 18-ranked Lalic downed Brunie, 6-3, 6-1, at No. 5 singles. No. 9-ranked Mydla closed out the singles sweep with a 6-4, 6-2 win over Labas at No. 2 singles.

Armstrong returns to action on Saturday, March 2, hosting No. 30 North Georgia at 1:30 p.m. in Peach Belt Conference action at Bacon Park.
