LSCM Students Tour Georgia Ports

On January 31, students from Christian Rosetti's, Ph.D., associate professor of logistics and supply chain management, LOGT 3232 class toured the Garden City Terminal of the Georgia Ports Authority. Jeff Neil, director of special projects, who guided the group through the terminal, explained important processes underlying the port's efficiency. He also discussed new projects such as a new berth and cranes and expounded on the Georgia Ports' commitment to environmental sustainability including conservation of several of southeast Georgia's oldest trees and reduction of the ports' carbon footprint.

In addition to the tour, the group enjoyed a great lunch that included a question-and-answer session with senior port leadership. The students were able to gain insights into the role of long- and short-term forecasting; using simulation and optimization to identify constraints and bottlenecks; budgeting, cashflow, cash reserves, and project finance; how strategic flexibility allowed the port to handle a 20% increase in TEUs; and the regional, national, and global economic impact of Georgia's ports.
