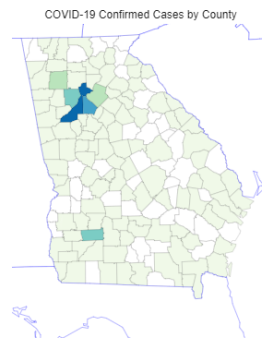
Statesboro Police search for shooter, one man dead

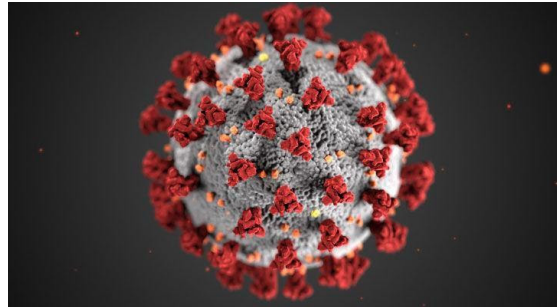
OPINION: The longer we don't listen, the worse it'll get
