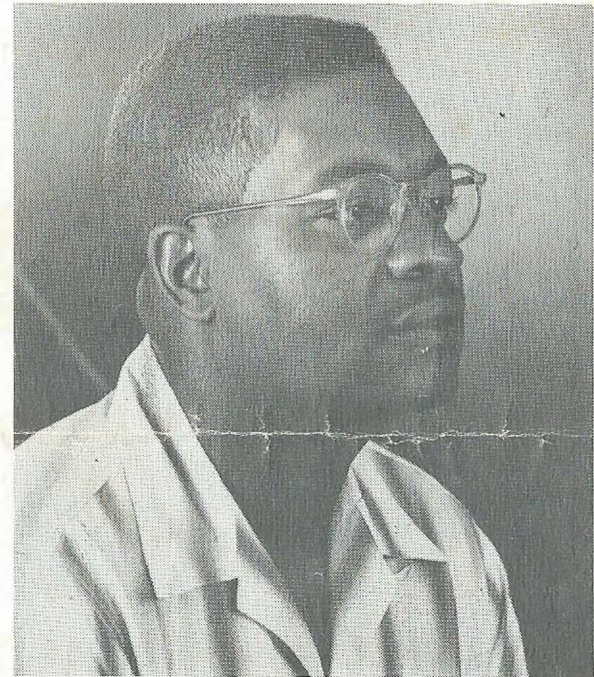

# Obituary
