A look back at last year's infamous book burning

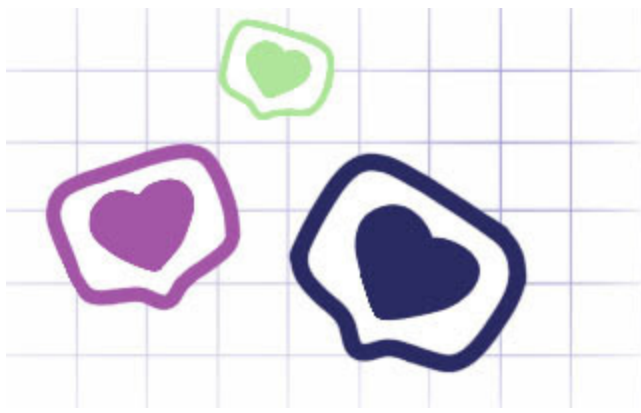
