Top-ranked Pirates knock off No. 9 Concordia (NY) on Tuesday

JACKSONVILLE, Fla. - The top-ranked and defending DII national champion Armstrong Atlantic State men's tennis team improved to 10-0 on the season with a 7-2 victory over No. 9-ranked Concordia (NY) on Tuesday afternoon at the UNF Tennis Courts in Jacksonville.

The Pirates handed the Clippers (2-2) their second loss on their Florida trip to open up the season. Concordia dropped an 8-1 decision at Barry on Monday.

The nation's top-ranked doubles duo of Alex Grubin and Anthony Boldarev knocked off AASU's fourth-ranked duo of Rafael Array and Mikk Irdoja, 8-6, at No. 1 doubles for Concordia (NY). The Pirates rebounded to win the next two doubles matches as Daniel Regan and Matus Mydla defeated Thomas Dobrotka and Andreas Lindell, 8-4, at No. 2 doubles and **Eudaldo Bonet** and Paul Fitzgerald blanked Raphael Namias and Felix Missal, 8-0, at No. 3 doubles.

In a battle of top ten-ranked singles players, second-ranked Grubin edged seventh-ranked Irdoja in a third-set 10-point tiebreak, 6-2, 1-6, (10-5) at No. 1 singles for the Clippers. Bonet knocked off No. 3-ranked Boldarev, 6-1, 2-6, 6-1, at No. 2 singles, while fifth-ranked Array beat Namias, 6-0, 6-1, at No. 3 singles.

Mydla defeated Dobrotka, 6-0, 6-1, at No. 4 singles for the Pirates, while Regan downed Lindell, 6-3, 6-0, at No. 5 singles and 38th-ranked Fitzgerald beat Missal, 6-1, 6-3, at No. 6 singles.

The Pirates return to action on Friday, March 5, with another showdown against a top 10-ranked foe as AASU takes on No. 4-ranked Lynn at 2:00 p.m. at Bacon Park.
