Top-ranked Pirates Pillage No. 11 Bobcats, 9-0

**MILLEDGEVILLE, Ga.** - The two-time defending NCAA DII champion and top-ranked Armstrong Atlantic State men's tennis team exacted revenge for its only loss of the 2009 season by knocking off No. 11-ranked Georgia College & State University, 9-0, on Tuesday afternoon at the Centennial Center Tennis Facility.

GCSU (3-2, 0-1 PBC) was the only team last season to knock off the Pirates (7-0, 4-0 PBC), doing so in a 5-4 victory back on Feb. 24 in Milledgeville. In that match, GCSU won two of three doubles and won two three-set matches, including the clincher at No. 4 singles.

This afternoon, the Pirates swept all three doubles matches and won five of six singles matches in straight sets, ending hopes of a repeat upset.

The fourth-ranked duo of Mikk Irdoja and Rafael Array knocked off the 16th-ranked duo of Jerome Leborgne and Joao Casagrande, 8-2, at No. 1 doubles while newly-crowned PBC Player of the Week Daniel Regan and Matus Mydla defeated Giovane Nucci and Johan Wadstein, 8-1, at No. 2 doubles. **Eudaldo Bonet** and Paul Fitzgerald completed the doubles sweep by winning a tight 9-8 decision over Max Beliankou and Leo Bernardes at No. 3 doubles.

Bonet led the charge in singles, dispatching Leborgne, 7-5, 6-1, at No. 1 singles. Seventh-ranked Irdoja beat Wadstein, 6-2, 6-2, at No. 2 singles and No. 5-ranked Array defeated Beliankou, 6-4, 6-1, at No. 3 singles.

Mydla downed Bernardes, 7-5, 6-2, at No. 4 singles. 38th-ranked Fitzgerald won a third-set 10-point tiebreak to defeat Nucci, 6-4, 2-6, (10-7), at No. 5 singles while Regan beat Wictor Anderson, 6-0, 6-4, at No. 6 singles.

AASU returns to action on Thursday, Feb. 25, with a 2:00 p.m. matchup against No. 15 Lees-McRae in Columbia, S.C. - a match postponed from earlier in the season due to inclement weather.
