Be not burdened with times of sorrow; I wish you the sunshine of tomorrow. My life's been full. I've savored much; Good friends, good times, and A loved one's touch.


Perhaps my time seemed all too brief; Don't lengthen it now with undue grief; Lift up your heart and share with me; God wanted me, He set me free.
