

The Way the Glass Sheets Are Clean-ed, Coated and Sensitized.

First of all the small sheet of glass destined to form the support for the sensitized film is carefully cleaned, so as to be ready to receive the preliminary coating upon which the sensitive film will afterward be placed. The sheets of glass are passed through a machine which first scrubs one side of the plate and then the other. A stream of clean water flows over the

surface of the glass all the time The work is all done automatic ally, and after all the plates are well scrubbed they travel under fine jets of water, which squirt away ev ery trace of dirt. The plates ther travel still further through the ma chine in order to receive the preli inary coating or "substratum." special liquid flowing over the surface of the plates.

In this manner the glass passes

in at one side of the machine, coming out at the other side cleaner and coated with an adhesive. The plates so treated are placed in racks and conveyed to a drying room. Of course all these prelimi-nary operations take place in the

The next operations, however, are carried on in almost complete darkness, as otherwise the light would spoil the sensitive film which is now placed on the glass. The technical name of the coating which is now applied is the "emul-sion," which is a preparation of sil-ver salts, extremely sensitive to ac-tion of light.

The body of the emulsion is formed of a kind of gelatin. This is kept liquid by the application of heat. 
