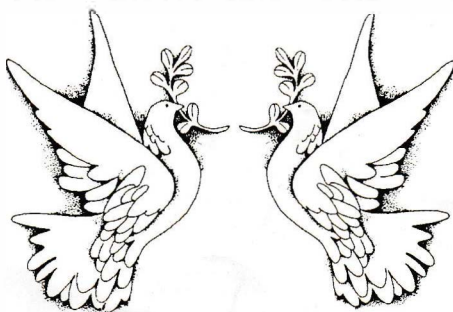

Dollie Sue Donaldson-Boursiquot, daughter of Mrs. Dollie L. Donaldson and the late William Donaldson, was born on February 20, 1952, in Pahokee, Florida. She was the youngest of seven children. In 1953, she moved to Fort Lauderdale, Florida, where she was reared.

Dollie was a natural born leader, with many talents and accolades. She graduated from Dillard High School in 1970, where she was very active. She was a member of the cheerleading team, art club, swim team, and an all-around athlete, just to name a few. She received numerous rewards as a track star and artist. She was voted Homecoming Queen and Best Artist by her class. Being a firm believer of the importance of a good education she kept herself abreast of the changing world through numerous seminars and college courses.

After completing high school, Dollie entered the United States Airforce, where she excelled and received an honorable discharge. While in the Air Force she was trained in Aerospace Science as an Aircraft Propeller Mechanic, which led to her employment with Eastern Airlines.

On June 27, 1984 she married Frantz Boursiquot, where they faithfully worshiped Christ at the New Golden Heights Church of Christ. They had a beautiful Christian relationship, working for the Lord together. Frantz preceded her in death on August 24, 1991. Dollie continued her services to God by serving on numerous committees, namely, Sick Committee, Prison Ministry, Zone Caring, and Feeding the Hungry. She was Chairperson of the Computer Technology Committee. Dollie was a very effective witness for Christ. She was responsible for bringing many souls to Christ, Dollie was faithful in her attendance in her worship and in her giving to God. She was always willing to lend a helping hand to those in need and want. Dollie's work and her presence will be sorely missed at Golden Heights.

And your sweet face, no more to see.

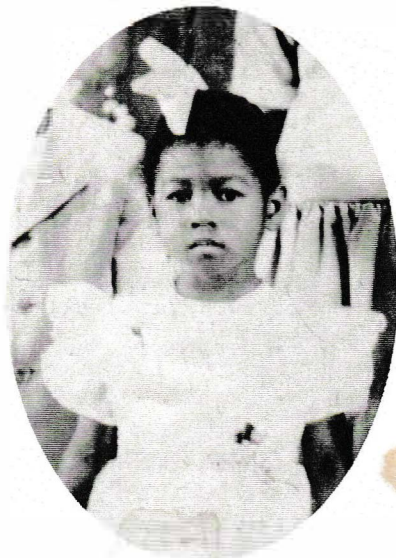
Oh, we will miss you so.
