### GSU's vaccination plan hits the fast lane

On March 25, Governor Brian Kemp announced during a press conference that vaccinations will be opened to anyone at least 16 years of age or older, allowing any adult the opportunity to be vaccinated. In line with this, Georgia Southern University has set plans into motion to help spread this vaccine to any interested.



### General information on the vaccine update

The reason as to why the cut off age was moved only to 16 years of age is due to the vaccines having been approved with a youngest recommended range of 16 to 18 year olds when they were given the emergency use authorization.
