Obituary

"When death has come and taken our loved ones, it leaves our homes so lonely and drear. Life is never all gladness nor all sorrow; after the darkest night, the sun will shine again."

The days of our years are threescore and ten and if by reason of strength they be fourscore years, yet is their strength, labor and sorrow. Deacon Sibley has had his threescore years and ten, and by reason of strength has passed his fourscore years and reached the age of 96. In those years there was labor and sorrow but were cut off early January 26, 1973 in Gilman Hospital between the hours of 4 and 6 a.m.

He was born October 5, 1876 to Adam and Grace Sibley. He was married early in life to Lucy Williams who preceded him in death. No children were born to this union but the couple reared 6 foster children and 2 of these preceded him in death.

In his journeying, he found out that he needed to prepare for a city which has foundations whose builder and maker is God. So, in 1919, he made up his mind to accept Christ as his personal Saviour and joined the Westlight Baptist Church where he served faithfully until his health failed.

He leaves to mourn one sister, Mrs. Gertrude Patterson, Jesup, Ga.; four foster children: Mrs. Ruby Lee Graham, Jacksonville, Fla., Mrs. Lonnie Mae Drummond, Messrs. Rufus and Malachi Banks, all of Woodbine, Ga.; one foster son-in-law, Laurie Drummond, Jr., Woodbine, Ga.; 16 foster grandchildren; 18 foster great-grandchildren; and a host of nieces, nephews, cousins and many other sorrowing friends.
