Although Melrose is no longer physically with us, her kind, gentle and caring spirit will live on in the hearts of those who loved her. You will always be a part of our lives.

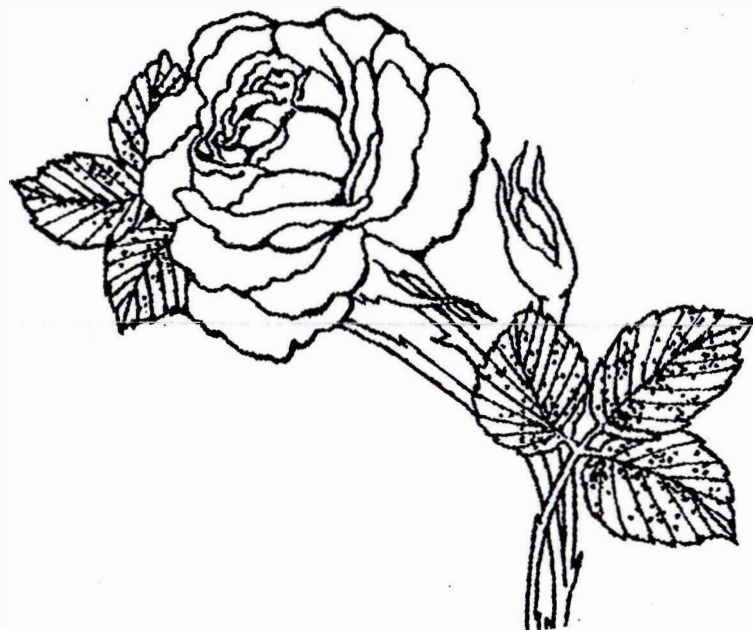
