Mrs. Fannie Tillman Robinson was the daughter of the late Mr. and Mrs. Antine Tillman.

She was born in Tattnall County, Georgia, on October 1, 1884, and departed this life Wednesday, February 4, 1976 in the Roanoke Chowan Hospital in Ahoskie, North Carolina.

Mrs. Fannie Tillman Robinson joined the Bethaven Primitive Baptist Church in Collins Georgia at an early age. She was a faithful member of the church and for many years served as the secretary. She was a faithful member of the church, regular in attendance and diligent in service until her health began to fail.

In 1963 she was taken to Ahoskie, North Carolina by her two sons, Rudolph and Alford Tillman, because her health was failing and they could take better care of her. Her friendliness and patience while bearing her pains of sickness won her the affection of many friends. Although she was unable to walk, she was an inspiration to the neighborhood and groups who came to see her.

She was the mother of six children, two daughters and four sons. Four of her children preceded her in death. She is survived by two sons, Mr. Rudolph and Alford Tillman, 29 grandchildren, 57 great grand children and 8 great great grandchildren and a host of relatives and friends.
