University System of Georgia announces Jaimie L. Hebert, Ph.D., as President of Georgia Southern University

ATLANTA (University System of Georgia) — Today, the Board of Regents of the University System of Georgia named Dr. Jaimie Hebert president of Georgia Southern University in Statesboro. Hebert will assume his new position on July 1, 2016. Hebert joins the University System of Georgia from Sam Houston State University in Huntsville, Texas, where he has been serving as the provost and vice president for academic affairs.

“Dr. Hebert’s experience and leadership qualities make him a natural fit for Georgia Southern University,” said Board of Regents Chair Kessel Stelling Jr. “We appreciate the hard work of the campus search committee, which included representation from alumni and the Statesboro community, for recommending such a qualified candidate.”

Hank Huckaby said, “Georgia Southern is on an upward trajectory, and Dr. Hebert will contribute substantially to the institution’s momentum from day one. This is an exciting time for Georgia Southern, which will continue to thrive and grow under Dr. Hebert’s leadership.”

“Georgia Southern is a great university, and I am honored to have the opportunity to serve this institution, its faculty, staff and students; and, the Statesboro community. I look forward to working with the campus and Statesboro community to take Georgia Southern to even greater heights,” said Hebert.

Hebert has served in various roles at Sam Houston State University since 1999. He has worked as a professor of mathematics and statistics, chair of mathematics and statistics, and dean of the College of Arts and Sciences.

He has also worked in higher education as an assistant professor of mathematical sciences at Appalachian State University (Boone, North Carolina).

Throughout his career, Hebert has been active in University-related, student-related, professional and civic organizations including: the Council of Academic Deans, SACS Compliance Committee (2009 reaffirmation), Standing Faculty Tenure Committee, Texas Association of Chief Academic Officers, Journal of Developmental Education, SHSU Rotoract Club, Tau Kappa Epsilon Fraternity (advisor), Rotary Club of Huntsville, and Huntsville/Walker County Economic Development Committee.

Hebert received a bachelor's degree, master's and a doctorate in statistics from the University of Louisiana-Lafayette.

Hebert has two daughters. Emily is a graduate student and Sarah is an undergraduate student.

Wild red-shouldered hawks nest at Georgia Southern

Red-Shouldered Hawk's Nest Live Cam



A pair of wild red-shouldered hawks have again returned to the Georgia Southern University Center for Wildlife Education and Lamar Q Ball, Jr. Raptor Center to nest atop an 80-foot yellow pine tree on the Wildlife Center's grounds. This year, the pair have laid three eggs and are dedicated to the incubation process. One egg has hatched and the other two are expected to begin hatching any day now. The Wildlife Center, in collaboration with Georgia Southern University's Information Technology Division, is providing a live stream video of the event available [here](#). The live stream provides natural history insights into the world of the red-shouldered hawk. To minimize any disturbance, the camera was installed before egg-laying began. The Wildlife Center supports and promotes the honest portrayal of nature.
