# Intercampus Travel and University vehicles

### Question(s):

---

- 1) Is the university planning to purchase, or has it already purchased, new vehicles for the motor pool to provide a means for travel between campuses?
- 2) If these vehicles have been recently purchased where did the money for these purchases come from?
- 3) Does the university have a policy regarding car-pooling with university vehicles between campuses?
- 4) Are certain individuals or administrative units privileged over others with regard to the availability of university vehicles?
- 5) Is the university planning to develop a university supported means of travel between campuses (such as a bus or van service or a ride sharing system) that does not involve the unreimbursed use of personal vehicles?

### Rationale:

---

The university owns and maintains a motor pool, in addition to departmentally purchased and maintained vehicles. Many chairs and administrators must commute twice or three times a week to the other campus. If they are unable to be reimbursed because of limited departmental travel budgets, they have effectively had a pay cut. If everyone who commutes drives individually it is an enormous waste of gasoline and resources. It is not possible for everyone who has to commute to individually drive a university vehicle. If the university were to develop a car pool policy or facilitate a ride share program among faculty/administrators, this would save individuals money out of pocket, as well as save the university resources dedicated to the motor pool. If the university were to develop a van or bus system between campuses, potentially even more resources could be saved
