Trojans Too Much for Eagles

Eagles fall to 11-10 on the season and host two conference foe's this weekend

STATESBORO, Ga. – Georgia Southern men's tennis fell to the Trojans 4-1 on Tuesday afternoon, to open up a six match home stand inside the friendly confines of the Wallis Tennis Center. The Eagles battled from the beginning, but the Trojans continued to fight back on a crisp afternoon in Statesboro.

[Eddie Landin](#) and [Diego Finkelstein](#) began the afternoon on a high note, defeating their opponents in doubles play 6-2. [Stefano Di Aloy](#) and [Artemie Amari](#) fell behind 5-4 in their match and were able to break sets to push the match to six all and force a tiebreaker. The Trojans would win on courts two and three to give Troy a 1-0 lead heading into singles play.

In singles play the Trojans continued to press their momentum taking a quick second point on court five. [Artemie Amari](#) gave the Eagles a spark winning 6-4, 6-3 in straight sets on court four. The Trojans would be able to hold off the Eagles on courts one and two and defeat the Blue and White 4-1. The Eagles will be back in action this weekend with Georgia State, if weather allows, and Appalachian State.
