Georgia Southern University's Center for Excellence in Financial Services and the Georgia Banker's Association will host the fifth annual Community Bank Symposium on March 23, 2011 at the Forest Heights Country Club in Statesboro.

The symposium will be an opportunity for bankers from around the southeast region of Georgia to discuss trends, legislation, and economic indicators that could affect the banking industry and the economy during the next year.

"This is a crucial time for everyone in the financial services industry," said Ed Sibbald, director of Georgia Southern's Center for Excellence in Financial Services in the College of Business Administration.
