"It was the prettiest little stadium in America," sobbed Dale Lick.

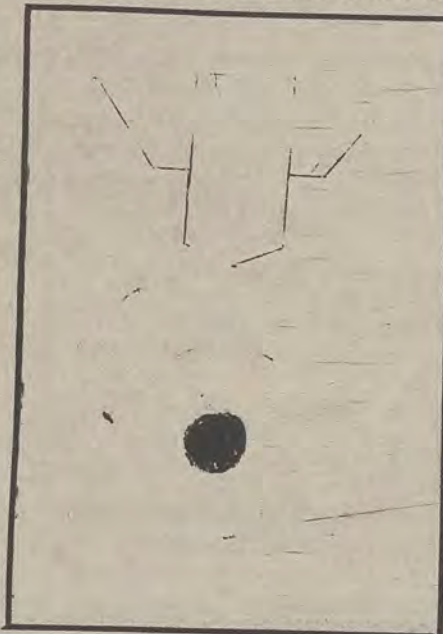
"It was the prettiest little stadium in America," Lick sobbed still clutching a piece of turf as he was escorted into a police car.

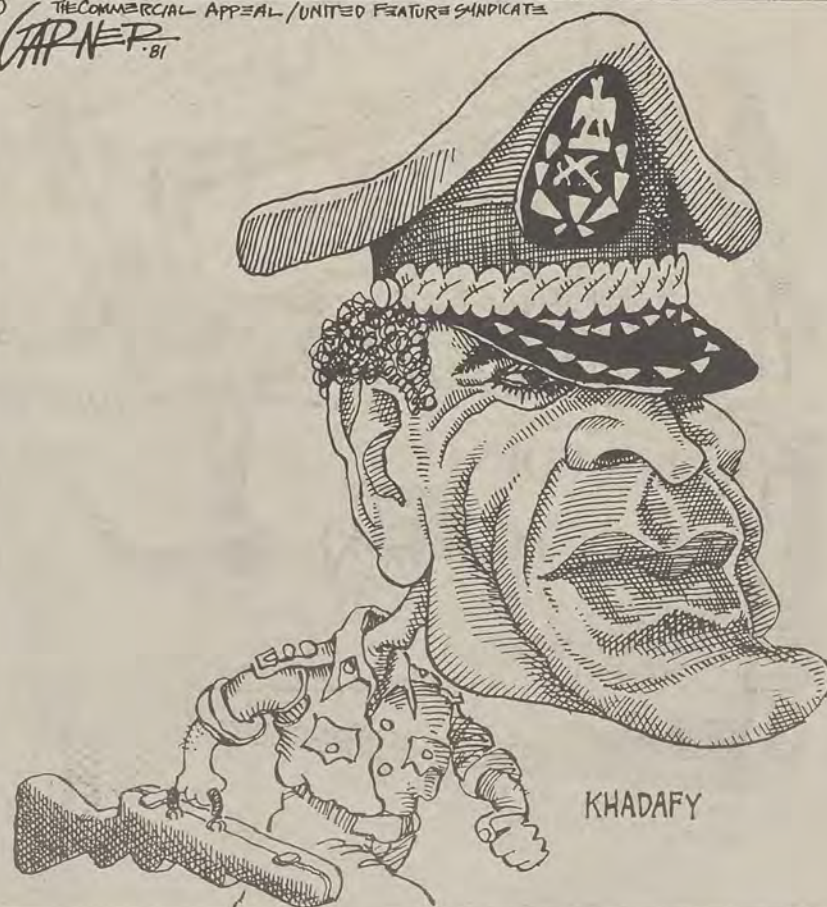
Georgia Southern College was destroyed last week when two missiles aimed at the Libyan city of Sierta overshot their mark striking the GSC campus.

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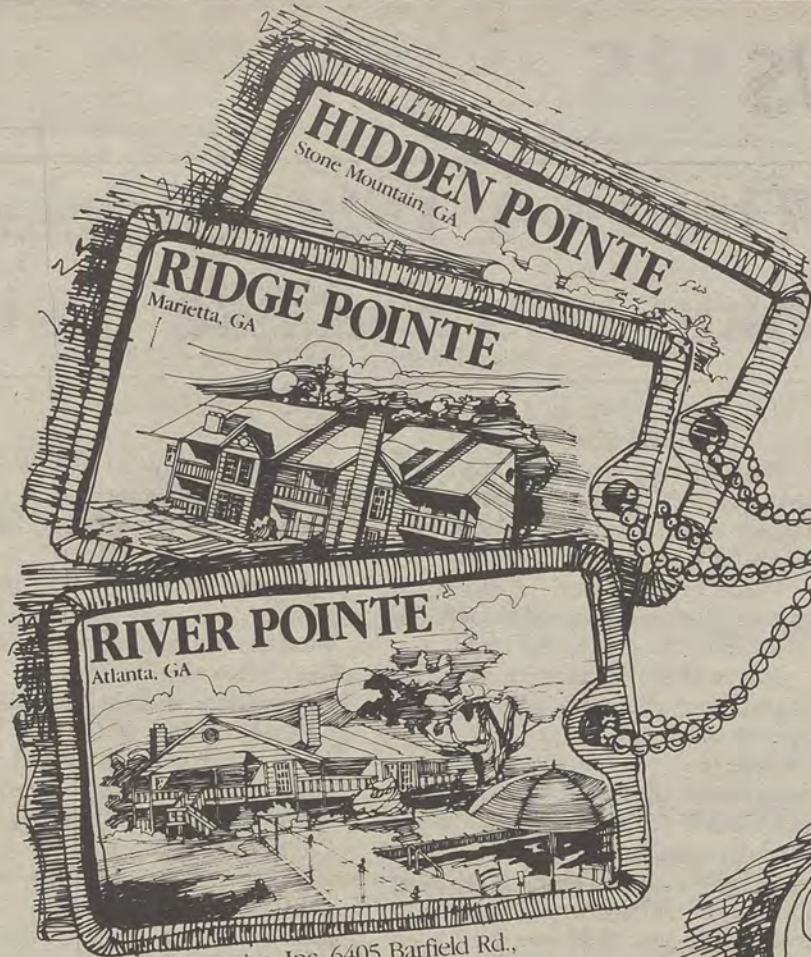

Students stunned; Wild Wyatt rampages

The communication arts department was rocked today when assistant professor and former acting head Ernest Wyatt allegedly attacked an unidentified female student with a Webster's Unabridged Dictionary.

The student, who was taken to Bulloch Memorial Hospital, suffered minor injuries.

The incident occurred after the student turned in a particularly weak one-sided editorial in Wyatt's JOURNALISM 443 class, said witnesses.

Eyes rolling and mouth foaming, Wyatt reportedly lunged at the student, shouting "Cogent! Cogent! I said make it cogent!"

The frightened journalism student tried to take refuge behind an IBM PC as her incredulous classmates stared, frozen in horror at Wyatt's maniacal assault, according to witnesses.

Wyatt was arrested by campus security officers within a short period and charged with battery and assault with the English language.

The possibility of Wyatt's action setting off a chain reaction of teacher-student assault was the subject of widespread speculation among professors.

President Dale Lick could not be reached for comment.

Wyatt is being held in the Bulloch County jail without bond.

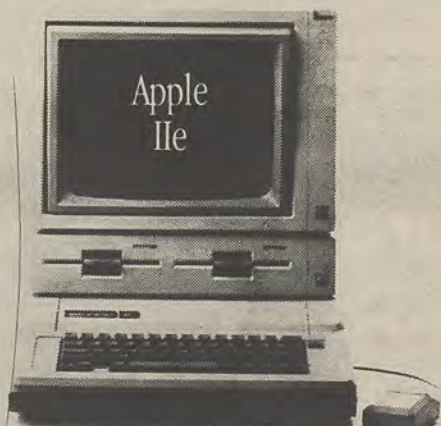

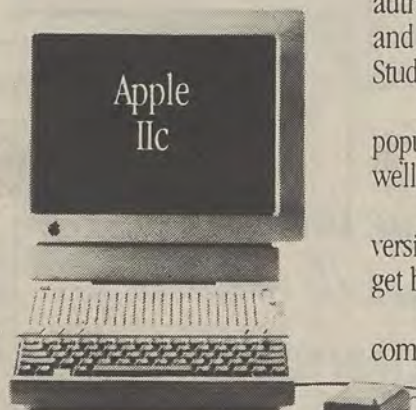

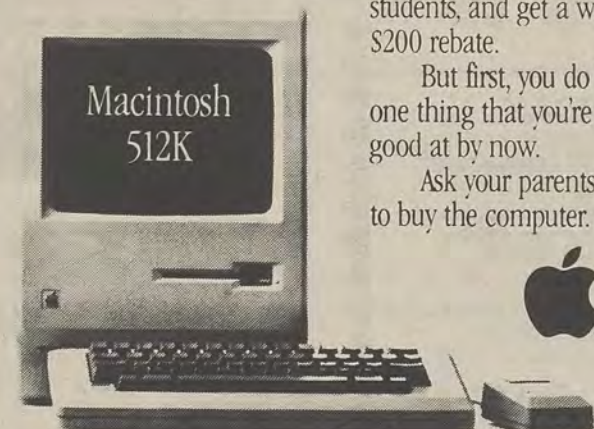

Erk Russell Signs The World's Top Football Prospects

Winning the 1985 Division 1-AA football championship has proven to be very significant for Eagle football recruiting as GSC's 1986 recruiting

crop has been rated the best in the nation by the FHA (Football Haters of America) rating service. Among the newcomers to Eagle country will

be two prospects who are rated as the best athletes since Samson and Goliath, Kre Lessur (Erk Russell spelled backwards) and Mah Ycart

(figure this one out).

According to Coach Erk Russell, Lessur is a bona fide All-Universe player who signed with GSC for a very significant reason.

"We look just alike," Russell explained. "He does everything just like I do, including smoking six-foot cigars and wearing his hair in an afro."

Russell further explained that GSC football will benefit in many ways from having an athlete of Lessur's caliber.

"Lessur is practically a one-man team," he said. "Now instead of having to go out into the hot sun everyday, we coaches and the rest of the players will be able to sit in President Lick's office and watch soap operas while Lessur does all the practicing. Also we've decided to have a giant TV screen installed on the ceiling of Paulson Dome so we can watch Soul Train and 'Rassling' on Saturday afternoons instead of football. Russell said that in order to sign Lessur, the Eagles had to outbid the Libyan Choir Boys, the Sandanista Freedom Fighters, and the Russian Angels.

"Yep, it really cost us a bundle," (reportedly a lifetime supply of Johnson's Baby Shampoo and the promise of being taught his A,B,C's) Russell said, "but he will definitely be worth it. At first we thought Libya had the inside track on signing him, but then he found out that they don't release a schedule of their games, and also the games are played in odd locations such as airports and hotels which usually results in a lot of fans being injured and killed. To top it all off, the life expectancy of a Libyan Choir Boy is one game. We offered him 11 games plus national media exposure through the *George-Anne*."

The other highly-rated prospect, Ycart, is just a "good ole south Georgia farm boy" from the Okeefenoque Swamp. The only distinction is he farms alligators instead of corn, soybeans, etc.

"We were really fortunate to sign Ycart," Russell said. "When I went down into the swamp to see him, he was rassling some big alligators. He told me that was what he wanted to do with his life and that he wasn't really interested in attending college. However, when I told him we were going to tangle with the biggest, meanest gators in all of Florida in our opening game this season, he quickly changed his mind. I had forgotten to bring a scholarship form along, so he signed his name on the belly of a 25-

interception of the year. Tim Foley's kick was good and GSC had tied the score at 35.

The Sooners scored with 12:03 left in the fourth quarter to take the lead at 42-35, but that was a close as they would get as Ham began to take control. On the Eagles fourth play of their next drive, the All-American quarterback hit Monty Sharpe on a 75 yard scoring strike to tie the game once again. Then after forcing the Sooners to punt, Ham, on a third down and 15, ziz-zagged his way around defenders 92 yards to give GSC a lead which they would never relinquish.

GSC iced the game at 1:03 in the fourth quarter when an Oklahoma fumble on the Eagles one foot line was picked up by defensive lineman Donnie Allen who took it all the way for the six.

The Meadowlands—Tracy Ham threw for 350 yards and rushed for 200 more to lead the GSC Eagles to a surprising 56-42 victory over the defending 1-A National Champion Oklahoma Sooners last night in the annual Kick-Off Classic.

This years encounter between these two giants of college football came about after the scheduled participants, Alabama

and Ohio State, were forced to drop varsity football because of a lack of support by their fans.

GSC won the toss and a crowd of 95,000 watched in amazement as Ham dashed 99 3/4 yards for the score on the Eagles first play from scrimmage. This unusually long run came about after Tony Belser tripped over a drain pipe on the kickoff.

Not to be outdone, coach Barry Switzers squad came right back with a 75 yard drive of their own to tie the score at seven. 
Khadafy stated further that the test is so difficult that even he had trouble completing in the allotted time.




