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LOOKING FOR RDM INFORMATION? WE'VE GOT A LIBGUIDE FOR THAT!



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INTRODUCTION

Atlanta University Center (AUC) Robert W. Woodruff Library serves member institutions of the world's largest and oldest consortium of Historically Black Colleges and Universities: Clark Atlanta University, the Interdenominational Theological Center, Morehouse College, and Spelman College (www.aucr.edu).

In an effort to address the evolving research needs of AUC faculty and students, the Library developed a Research Data Management (RDM) LibGuide to provide Library users with an overview of RDM, the components involved in the process, resources for building their knowledge base, and tools for managing their individual research projects.

HOME PAGE: OVERVIEW AND PURPOSE



“Our LibGuide is intended to outline practices for managing research data and guide researchers on how to best locate resources regarding data management. Our goal is to guide our institution members to the tools and information to facilitate their research data needs and assist in locating any additional information or resources required to fulfill Research Data Management (RDM) requirements including access to the DMPTool.”

PLANNING



Researcher must know the importance of data management plans. There are tools for managing data, metadata standards to follow, and data to cite.



BUILDING YOUR DMP

Portal to a web-based, free and open source application for building your data management plan. Examples are provided. Users can set up an institutional account.

TRAINING



Because research data fundamentals can be pretty complex. While on-site workshops are available, there are also online courses, some free to access, others fee-based.



FUNDING

There are a number of government and private grant funding agencies out there that require a data management plan as part of the grant application.

REPOSITORIES



There are good reasons to use repositories. Plus, there is a data repository for everyone in whatever field.



LEGAL CONSIDERATIONS

There are ethical concerns to consider. When re-using other's data, give proper citation. Post information or links to your institution's IRB.

CONFERENCES



Whether new or already familiar with data science or RDM, there are many like-minded folks to network with.



ADDITIONAL RESOURCES

This portal includes other resources on data management, news stories and developments, links to blog posts, and RSS feeds.

DISCUSSION

Our LibGuide, currently available at <https://research.aucr.edu>, has been promoted within the Library and to the AUC community. Reference librarians were trained and familiarized with content and know where to point patrons. New faculty and graduate students were introduced to the guide as part of their orientation.

Like all active LibGuides, the RDM LibGuide is updated periodically as new developments emerge. A page devoted to RDM policies and procedures is currently being developed. A Data Science minor will debut in Fall 2020, thereby making the LibGuide ever more essential to meeting students' research data information needs.

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
