GS has a quick turnaround and caps the fall at the Idle Hour Collegiate in Macon, Ga. Oct. 30-31. GS will use the same lineup as the previous four events, and junior Ansley Bowman will compete in her 21st career tournament.

The Eagles are coming off a second-place showing at the Terrier Intercollegiate last week. GS shot a season-low 295 in the final round and finished eight strokes behind tournament champion High Point.

[Natalie Petersen](#) posted the team's first round under par with a 71 in the first round and shot 73 in the second to tie for second. It was the freshman's second consecutive top-20 finish.

Petersen was one of four Eagles in the top-20 as [Sarah Noonan](#) tied for seventh, [Ansley Bowman](#) tied for 12th and [Ella Ofstedahl](#) tied for 15th.

Georgia Southern finished second in the tournament with 22 birdies and also placed second in par-4 and par-5 scoring for the week.
