## Tuition Fees Cut Drastically

On May 17, 1975 the Board of Regents met in Atlanta, Georgia to reconsider and recall the designated raise in tuition fees for the 1975-76 Armstrong school year. This recall was prompted by the asserted donations of Senior Enrico Antonio Fullamoni.

Sr. Fullamoni, who owns the Alimidon Pasta Company in Rome, Georgia, is a 1938 alumnus of Armstrong State College. He arrived in America at 19 and then traveled to Savannah to live with some friends who had come to America some years before from Palamero, Sicily. He was immediately accepted to Armstrong on a work-study program. There he prepared for his degree in Business Administration.

Sr. Fullamoni believes that Armstrong was partially responsible for his success in America and therefore he feels indebted to her. Sr. Fullamoni did not mention what he attributed the remainder of his success to. He commented on his bonds with Armstrong: "When you come from another country and a great American institution guides you like Armstrong guided me, you remain loyal. Loyalty is very important."

Sr. Fullamoni intends to materialize this loyalty with funds of \$200,000 a year if and only if tuition fees are lowered. "Knowledge should not be so hard to acquire. Money is not

everything."

The Board of Regents retired for nine hours to deliberate over the possible advantages and disadvantages of these type funds for Armstrong. At the end of the nine hours the Board of Regents inquired whether or not the only penalty for such funds would be lowered tuition fees. Sr. Fullamoni answered with an emphatic "Si!". He went on to say that there might be some friction if his donations were not accepted. "I have only come with my money now because I am in need of a hobby. It would be foolish not to accept. After all, my offer is one that you should not refuse." With no further qualms, the Board of Regents accepted.

Tuition fees for all upcoming quarters will be as follows: All

students, both graduate and undergraduate, who are registered for six hours or more, are required to pay \$3.00 in fees.

\$3.00 fee is broken down as follows: Student Activity Fee, \$.69; and Athletic Fee, \$.74.

Graduate and undergraduate students who are registered for five hours or less are required to pay only the \$.69 Health/Service Fee and the \$.75 Athletic Fee for a total of \$1.43. Students taking five hours or less may pay the additional \$1.57 Student Activity Fee each quarter.

All students, both graduate and undergraduate, must pay \$.25 ID Fee the last quarter of attendance during any academic year.
