### President Doherty denies adultery rumors

U.S. President Shannon Doherty is angrily denying rumors that she cheated on First Gentleman Andrew Shue while she was governor of California.

## Landrum eatery to be destroyed

GSU officials have finally decided to put it on the chopping block. Landrum Cafeteria, that is. The age-old building was officially condemned by inspectors representing the Board of Regents who visited the campus Monday.

Students should have no fear that their mail service will be cut off, since the newer expansion to Landrum that houses GSU Postal Services will be saved. Demolition of the older section is slated to coincide with the campus Fourth of July celebration.

"It'll be a real big bang, that's for sure," said Food Services Director Igor Smith. "I'll be really sad to see it leave, but at the same time this is ushering in a new era for food services at GSU. I've worked there since I got released from that mobile army surgical hospital in Vietnam. Landrum will always be my home."

To facilitate providing cafeteria services for GSU students, temporary ovens will be set up in Hanner Fieldhouse until better facilities can be built. Students will be served on the court with drink machines under the hoops at each end. A buffet will be placed on the visitor's side of the bleachers while students will be able to sit in the student bleacher section for their dining pleasure.

The cafeteria cannot be moved to a temporary building since the Board of Regents has blocked the construction of temporary buildings on Georgia college campuses.

"It's about time they got rid of that stinky old building," said student Homey D. Cloun. "You'd think all the roaches evacuating the building would be a big sign that something very wrong is going on in there. But what do I know? I'm just a student, not a building designer. I just hope the food quality goes up," he said.

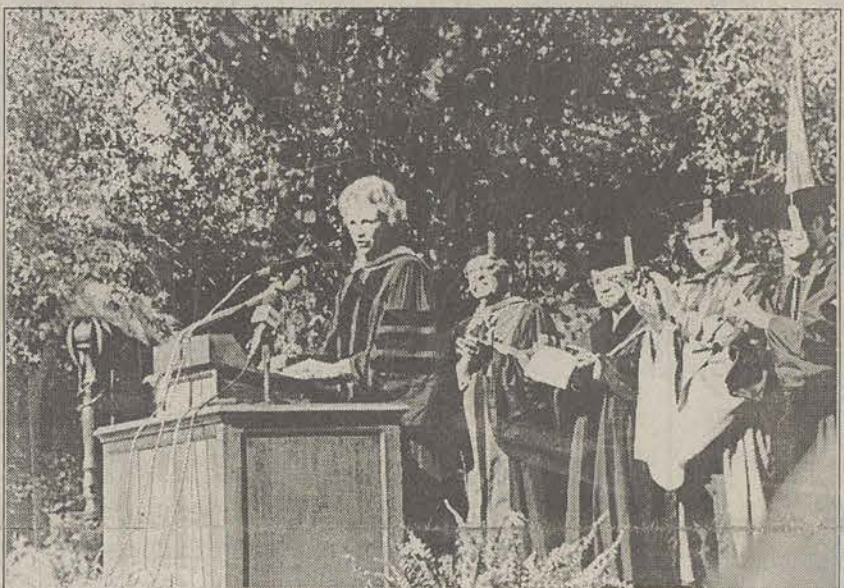
Until the Hanner Cafeteria is set up, students won't have an on-campus all-you-can-eat cafeteria.

Other GSU food service outlets such as the Sanford Snackbar, Union Station, and Lakeside Café have all extended their hours to handle all the overflow of student usage.

"We'll be swamped from dawn 'til midnight," said Lakeside manager Don King.

"I really think it's going to be quite a hassle for all students, faculty and staff involved, but I guess there's really nothing we can do about it but sit back and try to smile," he said.

## UGA loses status

The Board of Regents announced plans today to change the status of the University of Georgia. It will now become the Second District A&M school. There were several reasons for dropping UGA from its current status to one of no status, according to Chancellor Magdalene Harbinger.

The announcement came to the surprise of no one, as the enrollment at UGA had dropped to two literate students (who happen to run the independent student newspaper, the *Red and Black*) and 36,000 illiterate students. recognize Georgia Southern University as the front runner in education in the state," Harbinger said.

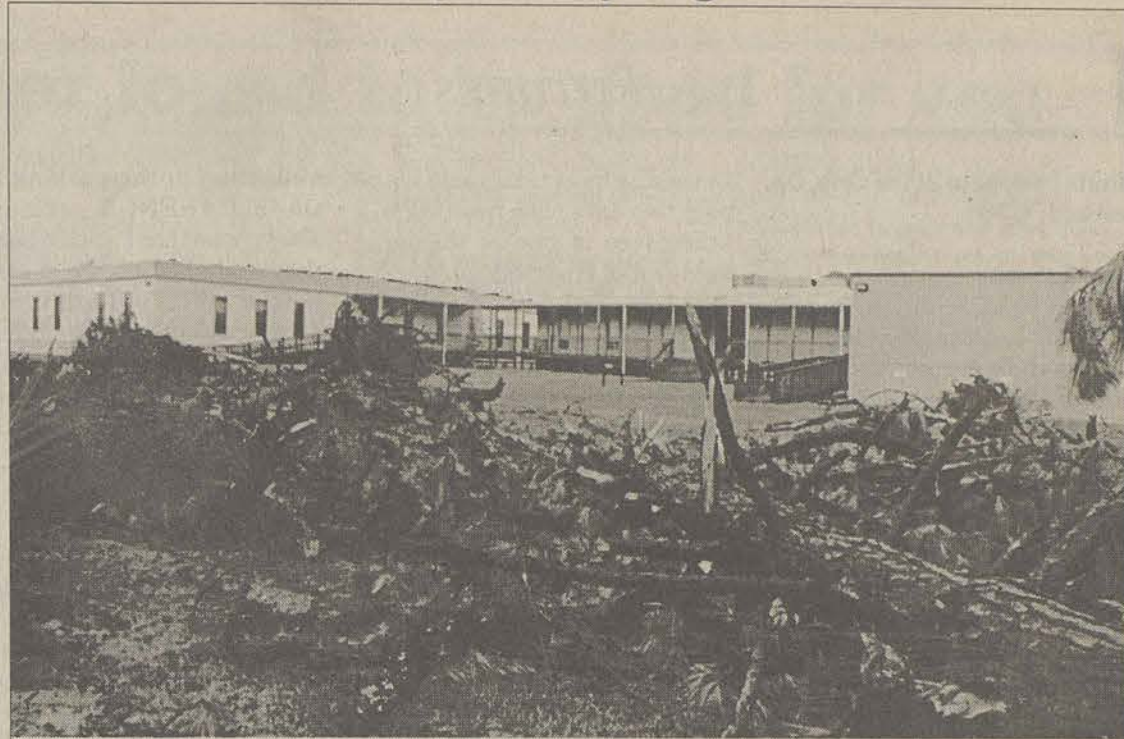
"I don't think there is a better place for an education than GSU. Enrollment now is an all-time high of 36,000 undergraduates and the student body still maintains a 3.89 average GPA. Not bad, not bad," she said.

Harbinger also said she wished other schools like Georgia Technical two-year college and West Georgia A&M would follow GSU's lead.

"It is amazing that these formerly highly-respected educational schools could now face being closed all together," Harbinger said. "It's a damn shame if you ask me."

## Last trees on campus demolished for space

GSU President Horoheta Ito called it "a necessary move to revolutionize our campus and bring it up to speed with other schools in Georgia." But student radicals are calling it murder.

Tuesday afternoon, the last trees standing on the landscape of GSU were demolished to make space for the Robert Chambers College of Resource Utilization.

A rally of three students screamed and pounded on the side of bulldozers as they uprooted the last pine trees, which were located behind the Hanner Complex.

The students were members of the radical group Sierra Club, which was declared an international terrorist organization in 2002. Despite the U.S. government's opposition to the group, then-GSU president Nicholas Henry granted them a chapter at GSU a year later. The three

protestors, who were sprayed with nerve gas Tuesday, are the president, vice-president, and treasurer of the group. They are also the only members.

"This is an outright crying shame," screamed Rita Redfern, Sierra Club president. "It's murder. President Ito should be shot."

The group also held a protest the day before in the Union Rotunda. The display included students dressed in rainforest garb dancing to the beat of Zulu drummers.

Ito ordered the removal of the last standing trees because there would not be enough faculty lounge space in the new college if the building were built around them.

The college is named after Robert Chambers, former director of parking and transportation, who dedicated his life to GSU. He was accidentally smothered under wet asphalt in 2004 during construction of a parking lot.

## Graffiti still a problem at GSU

Many GSU students are still fuming with anger over the outpouring of graffiti that has taken over the GSU campus. Among the sites that have been razed are Sweetheart Circle, Henderson Library, the George-Anne offices at the Williams Center, and yes, even Paulson Stadium.

One aspiring artist (or group of artists) took the initiative to write "Eagles suck" in indelible paint in the middle of GSU's home field. Public safety officials are currently investigating the incident and said it was the work of a group of inspired students.

"I tend to think that it was too big a job for just one person to pull off," said Sergeant Pepper. "I mean, look at how detailed the school logo is. I think it's kind of funny except for the fact that students are going to have to pay for the offending grass to be replaced."

Pepper said he is not aware of exactly when the incident occurred, except that it happened over spring break.

"I just don't understand how anybody would have been able to get in and out without one of our officers noticing it," Pepper said. "We have someone on duty every night across from the stadium at the Huddle House. I'm sure if anything were to have happened, our man would have noticed it."

In related news, more graffiti was found in Henderson Library. A vandal (or vandals) wrote "Michelangelo sucks" on the library stairwell. Pepper said he feels the two incidents are related.

"Finally we have those offenders where we want them. They won't be able to get away without paying under my administration."

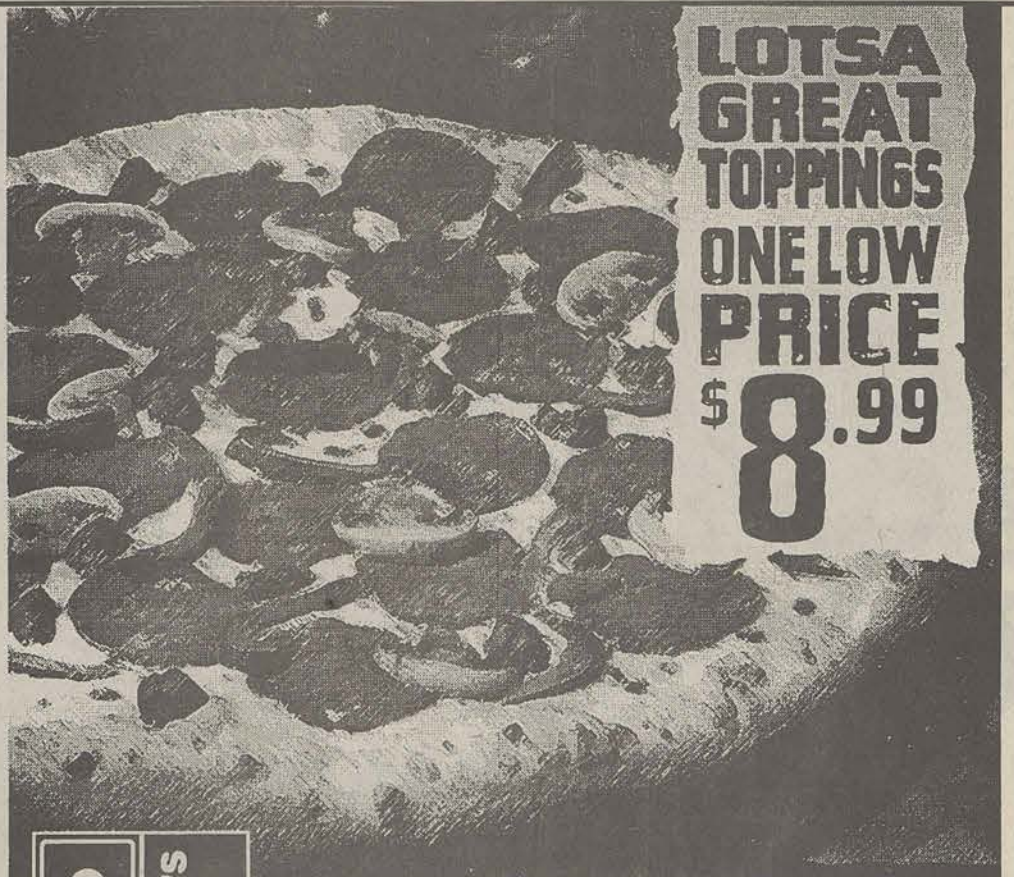

## Six die during dual meet; GSU now 9-0

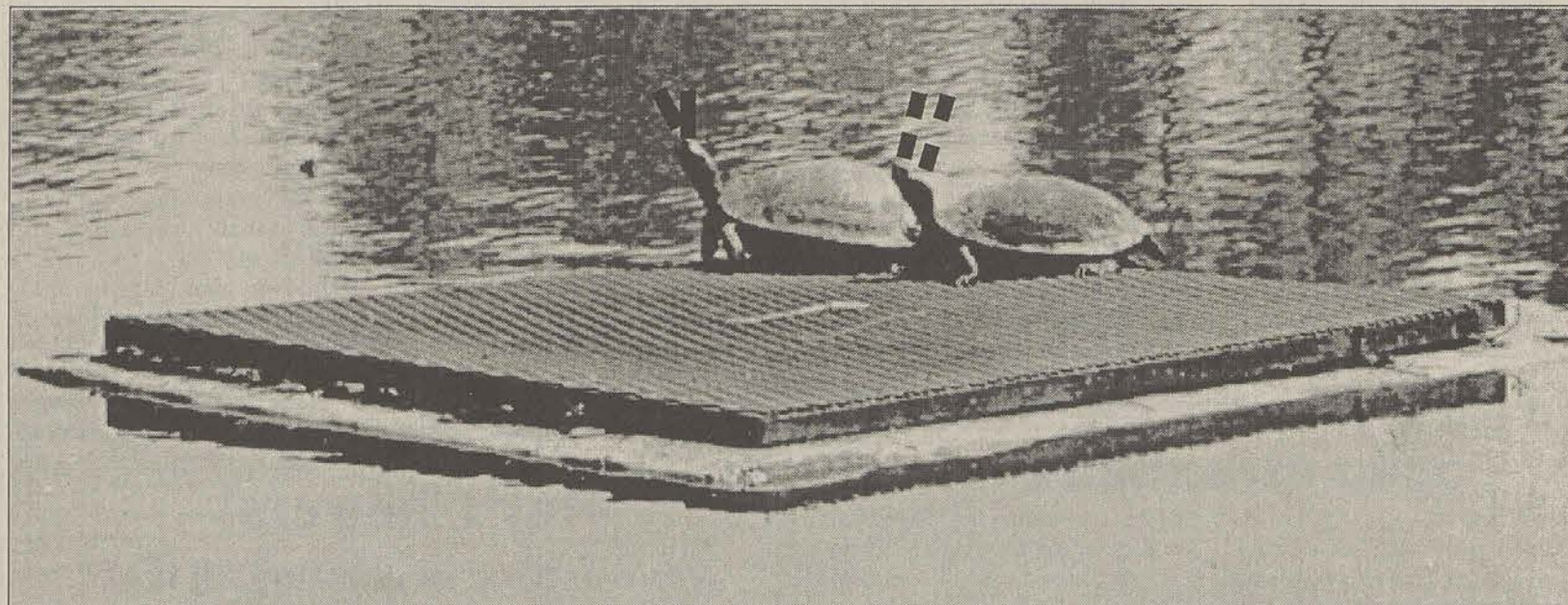
It was bulls colliding behind a great puff of smoke, like trains on the wrong track, whacking each other head on, only with sophomores in between.

Roaring and hollering like pickled banshees was kinda fun, yeah, and a lasting tribute to the six varsity bull fighters who ended up dead in the dual match against East Tennessee State and the University of Tennessee - Chattanooga Saturday. 1,500 fans attended the 12th annual Southern Conference Bullfight and Tractor Pull, held on Sweetheart Circle here in Statesboro.

"This is so we remember the trees that used to be here," said GSU President Hiroheto Ito.

(Note: There were once trees on Sweetheart Circle, before the great expansion boom began in the late 1980s.)

Eagle bullfighting coach Henry Nickles said poor conditioning and "some pretty mad damn bulls" contributed to the deaths.

"My guys were fat and stupid and out of shape," Nickles said. "Now they're dead."

Nickles refused to dwell on the downside, noting that a limited supply of bulls kept GSU from running up the score.

GSU senior Hewitt Dew said the combination of bullfight and tractor pull was interesting.

Dew, a math major, said that

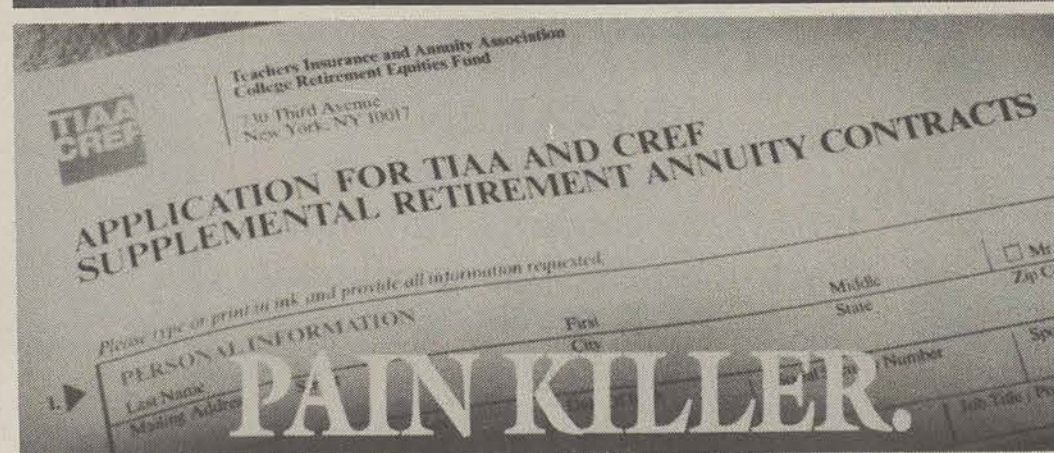
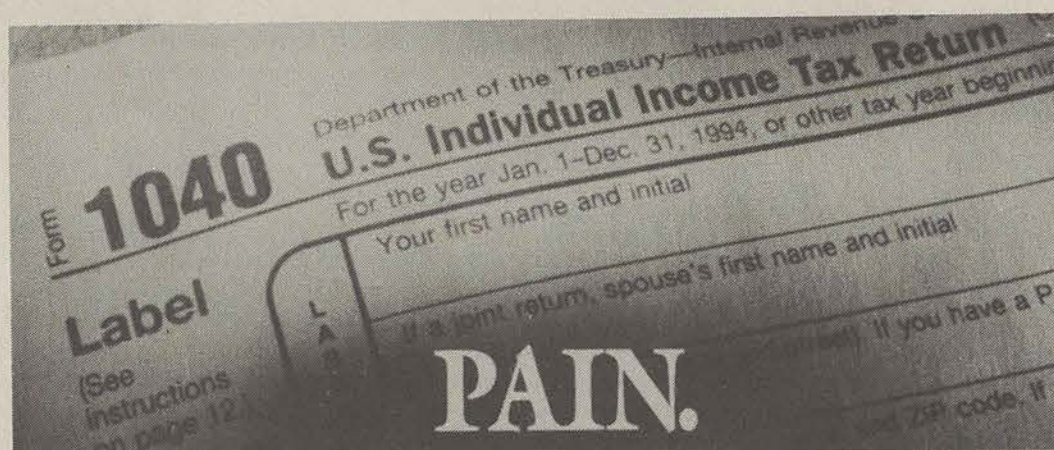

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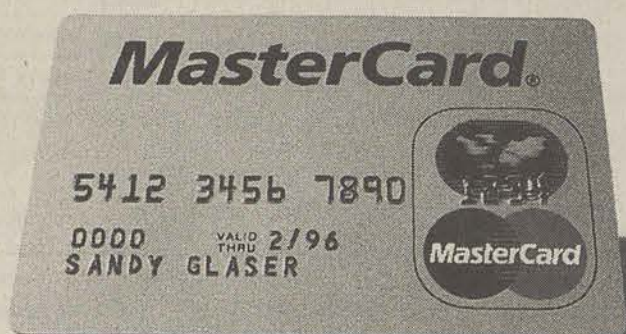






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
