Georgia Southern graduate admissions specialist Naronda Wright appointed to national board of governors

Naronda Wright, a graduate admissions specialist for Georgia Southern University's Jack N. Averitt College of Graduate Studies, was recently appointed to the governing board of directors for NAGAP, the Association for Graduate Enrollment Management, during its 2018 annual conference in New Orleans.

Wright has held various leadership roles on the organization's annual conference planning committee since 2015 and served as co-chair of the most recent conference.
