Georgia Southern to host newly admitted, prospective students during Eagle Previews

Newly admitted and prospective Georgia Southern students have the opportunity to experience one of the University's three campuses for themselves during Eagle Previews, comprehensive admissions open-house events happening on the Statesboro, Armstrong and Liberty campuses.

Georgia Southern hosts these events to offer students and their families one-on-one access to representatives from the University's academic colleges, student services departments and the Office of Admissions. University leaders also host break-out sessions on admissions, housing, financial aid, leadership and community engagement, and more.

An Eagle Preview for Georgia Southern's Statesboro Campus will be held on Saturday, Feb. 2, from 8 a.m. to noon. Students can explore the 900-acre residential campus while learning about the wide range of hands-on degree programs and student activities.

Students can visit the Armstrong Campus in Savannah on Saturday, Feb. 16, from 8 a.m. to noon, and tour the 268-acre arboretum campus. They will also be able to explore residential halls and campus facilities, and attend informative break-out sessions to learn more about unique campus offerings in addition to a variety of degree programs.

On Tuesday, Feb. 26, from 4 to 6 p.m., students can tour the Liberty Campus, a state-of-the-art facility that offers an intimate learning environment where local students can further their education.

The Eagle Previews will also provide an opportunity to learn more about the University's in-state tuition offerings to residents of South Carolina, Florida, Alabama, North Carolina and Tennessee on the Armstrong and Liberty campuses.

Georgia Southern economics students take fourth place in national trading competition

Parker College of Business students were top performers at the national TD Ameritrade's thinkorswim Challenge

A team of four economics majors at Georgia Southern University's Parker College of Business recently took fourth place at TD Ameritrade's thinkorswim Challenge, a real-world cash trading experience, after going head-to-head with 500 college teams from around the country.

"This competition enhanced students' critical and analytical thinking skills," said Omid M. Ardakani, Ph.D., assistant professor of economics. "They learned how to connect theoretical concepts with practice, which bridges the gap between theory and the real world. The skills they developed during this challenge will help them in their future career."

Handed a portfolio with \$500,000 in virtual dollars to trade stocks, options and exchange-traded funds, teams were challenged to put classroom theories into practice and see who could earn the most money with professional-level technology using the paperMoney trading simulator.

Students Shaye Escritor, Nathan Insel, Angel Lopez-Akiyama and Layke Touchet, led by Ardakani, invested their funds in equities and financial derivatives. Their group, called Alpha Team Hedge, realized an average return of 187 percent by the end of the challenge.

The group outperformed index funds, hedge funds and other teams by using theoretical and empirical knowledge of financial derivatives taught by Ardakani in his financial derivatives course. In total, the group was able to grow their initial portfolio to more than \$1.4 million.
