STATESBORO, Ga. - Georgia Southern Director of Athletics [Tom Kleinlein](#) announced Friday the promotion of [Nick Scully](#) to Director of Athletic Facilities/Event Management, effective immediately. Scully, who is in his third year at GS, was previously the assistant director of the same department.
