“I am honored to share my thoughts and my experiences of local weather and the tropical storm season, and I’m excited to share views of the heavens,” Prokop said. “It’s amazing what’s out there in a sky near you.”

In addition to serving as a meteorologist for over 20 years in the Savannah area, Prokop is an avid gardener and an amateur astrophotographer, who uses his telescope to take photos of

nearby celestial bodies.

Prokop’s interest and study of climate change began during his tenure as a graduate student at Saint Louis University’s School of Meteorology in 1975. Since, he has dedicated himself to finding greener, more sustainable energy solutions.
