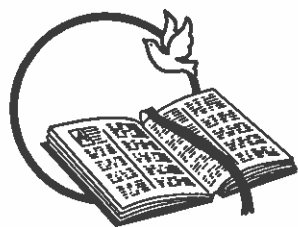

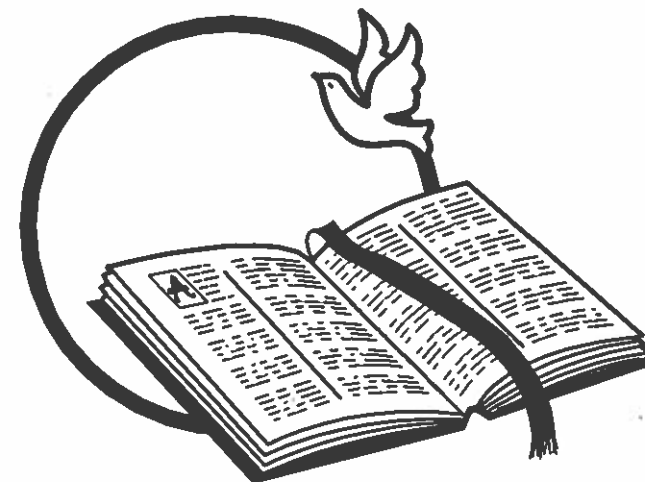

Obituary

Hattie Mae Hill Cooper, daughter of the late John and Anna Hill, was born April 1, 1914 in Bulloch County, Georgia. She attended the public school of Bulloch County and was joined in marriage to the late Tommy Cooper on August 7, 1932, in Bulloch County. She was the mother of six daughters, one of whom preceded her in death. Hattie was baptized at an early age at the Magnolia Baptist Church in Statesboro, Georgia. She later joined the First Bryant Baptist Church in Savannah, Georgia and sang in the choir. In 1960, she relocated to Cleveland, Ohio and joined the Mt. Gillian Baptist and Concord Baptist Churches. She was a willing worker in the church and served on several auxiliaries such as the Mother's Board, Deaconess Board, and the Senior Choir, she also served as President of the Trustee Board.
