Psalm 23

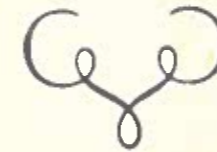

The Obituary

Green Dupree, Jr. was born October 25, 1930 to Green DuPree, Sr. and Martha Lee in Cincinnati, Ohio. He departed this life Wednesday, March 20, 1996 at 4:15 in the afternoon.

His formal education was at Woodlawn Elementary, Stowe School and the old Central Vocational High School.

Green confessed Christ in his preteens and attended Mt. Moriah Baptist Church, Lincoln Heights, Ohio. Years later, he became a deacon at 1st Baptist Church of Lincoln Heights, where he served faithfully.

Green DuPree was joined in Holy Wedlock to Miss Angela Carter, August 6, 1949. They were blessed with five children. One child, Debbie, preceded him in death.

He worked at Phillip Carey's-Celotex plant in Lockland, Ohio for 39 years. During this time, he continued his education to become a licensed Electrician and Pipefitter.

Green was the type of person who loved to be around people. He also enjoyed "true" jazz music. He always had a pleasant smile and always committed himself to helping others.
