Mrs. Maesam (Mae) Cone was born in Bryan County July 28, 1904, the daughter of the late Mr. John and Mrs. Florence Brown. At an early age, 11 years, she connected herself with the Mt. Gilead Baptist Church, Bryan County, Ga. Later in life she moved to Bulloch County, near Portal, Ga., and immediately joined the Scarbor Grove Baptist Church under Rev. W. M.
