Mr. Johnnie L. Cone was born to the late John and Mary Cone on November 10, 1919, in Bulloch County, Stilson, Georgia.

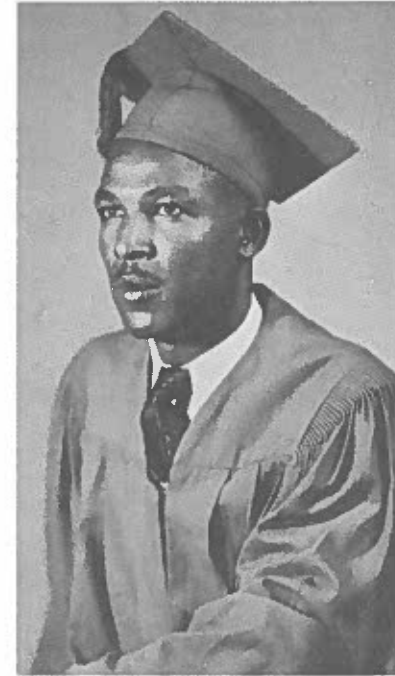
