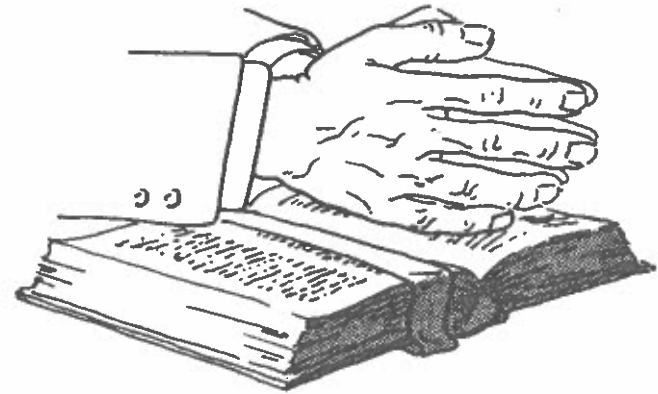

Obituary

Harvey Davis was born on August 2, 1925 in Statesboro, Georgia. He was the son of the late Mrs. Martha Davis.

Mr. Davis attended public schools in Bulloch County, Statesboro, Georgia. He graduated from Boggs Academy in Waynesboro, Georgia in 1947. From there Mr. Davis moved to New York City, New York in 1948. In New York, Harvey began a salesman career with Gimbels Brothers Department Store.

On September 22, 1950, Harvey Davis was inducted in the U.S. Army. The military became his new way of life. He saw active Military Service during the Korean War between 1951 to 1952, and served in Vietnam from July 1966 to July 1967. SFC (Ret.) Davis remained in the service until August of 1972. During the 22 years of service, he traveled extensively throughout the United States, Europe and Asia. He also received various Military honors and awards.

Mr. Davis furthered his education after retiring from the service, by attending Vocational schools in Washington and Georgia.

Harvey Davis married the late Carrie Lee Barriner on December 27, 1955. Three beautiful children were born from this marriage.

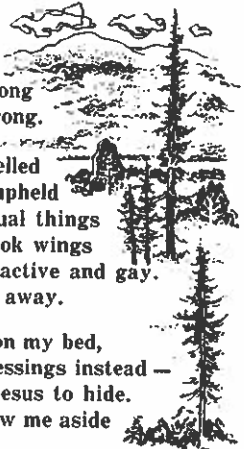
Mr. Davis was a member of Rehovia Baptist Church, where he served on the Deacon Board.
