Obituary

Mr. Curtis Frink, was born on February 4, 1941 the 4th child out of 9 siblings born to Hagin and Lillie Mae Frink in Statesboro, Georgia. He passed into eternal rest on Saturday, February 27, 2016 at Kindred Hospital in Atlanta, Georgia.

Curtis Frink attended William James High School in Statesboro, GA. As a young boy, he learned the rewards of hard work by attaining odd jobs to earn money. He understood the importance of a good work ethic and saving money while doing odd jobs as a caddy at the Country Club and cleaning graves at Bulloch Memorial Gardens. Many days he walked to the County Club where eventually with his hard earned money, he obtained his first bike – the first one in his family. He enjoyed cooking, family and singing. Curtis and cousins formed a gospel group where they found great pleasure singing in the community.

Curtis was a hard worker, setting high goals for himself and his family. He was a dedicated employee at Georgia Southern University as the Food Service Manager for forty-six years. During his career at GSU, he received several awards and gifts. He retired from GSU in 2004, but he continued his affiliation with GSU and was an honorary guest at the GSU annual Summer Tradition for many years.

Curtis and Nina Frink were married over thirty years and shared four children. He became a member of Bethlehem Church in Statesboro, Ga where he devoted his life to God and to the community. He was an active member in the Community Brotherhood Fishing Auxiliary. He served the community by assisting displaced families who lost their homes, built safety ramps, provided yard service, cooked and served meals to the elderly and provided monetary assistance for families during times of bereavement.

He is preceded in death by his parents; three brothers: James Frink, Dewitt Frink and Hagin Frink Jr., one sister Ola Mae Menefield, one son Conley Frink, and a special friend, Rosa Lee Spells.

He leaves to cherish his memories, a son Kerry Frink of Augusta, Ga., two daughters Marie Striggles of Lawrenceville, Ga and Shearonda Frink of Savannah, GA; three sisters Gracie (Sonny) West of Brooklyn, N.Y., Betty Fuce and Christine Frink of Fort Lauderdale, Fla; one brother Lloyd Frink of Brooklyn N.Y. He has five grandchildren: Victoria, Pershay, Justin, Raymond and Conley and a host of nieces, nephews, and other relatives and friends.
