Mrs. Sarah Funton was born January 8, 1876, the daughter of the late MR Andrew and Mrs. Sarah Brown in Laurens County, Soperton, Georgia, where she grew up into adulthood. At an early age she saw the need for religious guidance and connected herself with the Mount Zion Baptist Church, Soperton, Ga. She was first married to Mr. Dan Glover of Cochran, Georgia and to this union four children were born, two of which proceeded her in death. After the death of Mr. Glover in 1902, she moved to Bulloch County Georgia seeking a better way of life for herself and ~~her~~ family. Here she met and married Mr. John Fulton in 1924. No children were born to this union. After leaving Laurens County she found it impossible to fulfill her church obligations, there and she connected herself with The Springhill Baptist Church, under Rev. R.I. Hagins. Here she remained faithful until her health failed. She became unable to attend services physically, but she was always present in spirit. During her illness she carried it as she had carried herself in health, with a quiet, peaceful attitude. She was loved by all who knew her and her peaceful disposition, and she has influenced many who came in contact with her. On September 11, 1963 she entered into eternal rest following an extended illness. She leaves to mourn her loss a husband Dea.
