Georgia Normal Bows to Norman Park. 6-0

Normal went down in defeat before Norman Park yesterday to the tune of 6-0. This was a close hard fought game, which the score indicates, furnishing plenty of thrills throughout the game. Manley, Redfern and Galloway were the outstanding players for the visitors, while Cail, Rushing and Boswell played unusually good ball for the Normal.

The game play by play is as follows: Capt. Rushing won the toss and chose to defend the west goal. Beasley kicked 45 yds. to Redfern who was downed in his tracks by Cail. Yearwood hit tackle for 1 yd. NeSmith threw Galloway for 0 yd. loss. Yearwood kicked 20 yds. to Baker who toss downed. Cail failed to gain around end. A pass Beasley to Cail fell incomplete. Another pass Cail to NeSmith was incomplete, Normal was then penalized 5 yds. A pass Beasley to NeSmith was incomplete.

Normal Parks ball on own 31 yd. line--Redfern hit center for 1 yd. Yearwood rammed center for 2 yds. Galloway circled right end for 3 yds. Yearwood punted 30 yds, the ball falling dead.

Normal's ball on its own 35 yd. line--Beasley hit tackle for 5 yds. Screws lost 3 yds on a fake play. Baker made 3 yds around left end on a triple play. Beasley kicked 50 yds. to Redfern who returned 10 yds.

Normal Park's ball on its own 0 yd line--Redfern made 3 yds around right end. Yearwood made 5 yds over center. Adams substituted for Screws. Yearwood punted 25 yds the ball falling dead.

Normal's ball on its own 48 yd. line--Beasley lost 1 yd at right guard. Baker failed to gain around left end. A pass Rushing to NeSmith was incomplete. Beasley kicked 45 yds to Redfern who was downed in his track by Boswell.

~~Normal's ball on its own 35 yd. line--Beasley hit tackle for 5 yds. Screws lost 3 yds on a fake play. Baker made 3 yds around left end on a triple play. Beasley kicked 50 yds. to Redfern who returned 10 yds.~~
Norman Park's ball on its own 10 yd line--Manley got 2 yds off tackle. Galloway was thrown for 10 yds loss. Yearwood punted 30 yds to Cail who returned 5 yds. Bennet's arm was dislocated on this play but he stayed in game.

Normal's ball on Norman Park's 30 yd line--Baker rammed center for 5 yds. A pass Beasley to Cail was incomplete. On the next play Manley intercepted a pass.

Normal Park's ball on its own 35 yd line--Manley got 3 yds over tackle. Yearwood hit guard for 1 yd. Redfern circled right end for 2 yds. Yearwood punted 30 yds. the ball falling dead. Time out Normal Park. Parrish replaced Bennett at Left End for Normal Park.

Normal's ball on its own 30 yd line--Baker lost 7 yds when he attempted to circle right end. Cail got 2 yds over right guard. Rushing hit tackle for 5 yds. Beasley punted 40 yds to Yearwood who fumbled and Adams recovered. Baker lost 1 yd on attempted left end run.

The first period ended here 0-0.

Adams made 5 yds on a fake play around right end. A pass Cail to Adams was incomplete. Beasley kicked 35 yds to Redfern who was tackled by Adams.

Norman Park's ball on its own 10 yd line--Lowery threw Redfern for 1 yd loss. Yearwood got 2 yds over right guard. Yearwood kicked 35 yds. Beasley punted 20 yds the ball falling dead.

Normal Park's ball on its own 11 yd line--Galloway swept around right end for 5 yds. Yearwood hit tackle for 4 yds. Galloway got 1 yd at center and first down. Yearwood got 2 yds at tackle. Manley hit right guard for 7 yds. Manley got 2 more yds at center and another first down. Yearwood hit right tackle for 2 yds. Pass Galloway to Parrish incomplete. Another pass Galloway to Yearwood fell incomplete. Yearwood made 14 yds on a beautiful right end run, placing the ball on its own 48 yd line. First down Norman Park. F. Mathis went in for Thompson. Redfern failed to gain around left end. Galloway thrown for 5 yd loss on an attempted left end run. Time out Normal Park. Third down and 15 to go. Yearwoods passed to Parrish net a 10 yd gain. Manley hit center for 3 yds but failed to make first down.

Normal's ball on its own 35 yd line--Adams thrown for 6 yd loss on fake play. Cail got 17 yds over center on a beautiful run.

The half ended here. 0-0.

Beasley kicked 40 yds to Redfern who returned 10 yds. Norman Park's ball on its own 30 yd line--Manley hit center for 2 yds. Play called back and Norman Park penalized 5 yds, off sides. First and 15 to go. Galloway gained 1 yd over center. Normal off sides, play called back and penalized 5 yds. Manley hit center for 20 yds. add was downed by Cail. Galloway failed to gain at center. Manley got 3 yds.

at right guard. A pass Galloway to Redfern was complete and good for 40 yds. First down with Norman Park in possession of the ball on Normals 5 yd line. Yearwood got 1 yd at center. Redfern failed at center. Galloway failed to gain around right end. Boswell was hurt on this play but stayed in game. Galloway failed to gain on another right end run. Ball went over.

Normal's ball on its own 5 yd line-- Rushing hit center for 3 yds. Rushing again got 3 yds at center. Beasley kicked 40 yds to Redfern who was downed by Adams.

Normal Parks' ball on 50 yd line-- Yearwood made 3 yds around right end. Manley rammed right tackle for 4 yds. Manley got 4 more at guard and first down. Redfern made 3 yds around left end. Manley hit center for 3 yds. Manley got 16 yds over center and first down. Manley hit tackle for a touchdown. Hammett failed to kick goal. The score was 6-0.

Blakely kicked 30 yds to Boswell who returned 10 yds.

Normal's ball on its own 40 yd line-- Rushing got 5 yds over center. A pass Rushing to Cail was incomplete. Beasley hit right tackle for 2 yds. Beasley kicked 40 yds to Redfern who returned 15 yds, then fumbled but Galloway recovered.

Normal Park's ball on its own 35 yd. line--Manley got 4 yds at center. A pass Yearwood kicked 35 yds to Baker who was downed in his tracks. A pass Beasley to Adams fell short. Cail got 28 yds through center placing the ball on Normal Park's 46 yd line, and first down. Time out Norman Park. Stokes substituted for Holloway. Baker got 4 yds at right guard. Adams thrown for 5 yd loss on fake play. A pass Cail to Baker fell incomplete. The third period ended here. 6-0.

Rushing kicked 30 yds out of bounds. Normal Park's ball on its own 20 yd line--Manley rammed center for 11 yds. and first down. Manley got 4 more around right end. Redfern hit right guard for 2 yds. Time out Norman Park. Manley hit right tackle for 4 yds and another first down. Galloway failed to gain over guard. Pass Galloway to Redfern incomplete. Another pass Galloway to Parrish fell incomplete and Norman Park was penalized 5 yds. Yearwood punted 35 yds to Cail who returned 10 yds placing the ball in midfield. Jones substituted for Beasley.

Normal's ball on 50 yd line--Jones was got 3 yds over center. A pass Rushing to Baker fell incomplete. A pass Rushing to Adams was good for 25 yds. Adams punting the ball out of the other end. Time out Normal. Jones failed to kick

over tackle. Rushing hit right tackle for 1 yd. A pass Cail to Adams was good for 6 yds. Another pass Cail to Rushing was good for 4 yds and first down. Baker hit right guard for 2 yds. Baker got 1 yd at center. A pass Cail to Baker was incomplete. Another pass Cail to Rushing fell incomplete. The ball went over.

Normal Park's ball on its own 10 yd line-- Galloway circled left end for 2 yds. Yearwood failed to gain at center. Yearwood kicked 40 yds to Cail who returned 20 yds.

Normal's ball on Normal Parks 30 yd line--Time out Normal. Tillery went in for NeSmith. Tillery made 3 yds around right end. Tillery circled left end for 3 more yds. On the next play Blakely intercepted a pass.

Norman Park's ball on its own 25 yd line--Redfern hit center for 5 yds. Yearwood went over guard for 10 yds and first down. Manley hit right guard for 3 yds. Redfern hit right tackle for 10 yds and another first down.

The game ended here 6-0.
