Obituary

Another soldier is gone to get a just reward. He kept the faith and ran the race and is now gone home to God.

The Rev. J. G. Hagins was born in Bullock County, Georgia, March 31, 1895. He was the son of the late Mrs. Louise and Jack Hagins, Sr., both of whom preceded him in death years ago.

At an early age Rev. Hagins (at that time was Mr. Hagins) joined the St. Mary Baptist Church in Statesboro, Georgia and rendered untiring service there. Upon moving to Laurens County, in keeping with the covenant, he joined the Green Green Baptist Church and remained there until the end.

He was ordained to the ministry in 1923 under the leadership of Rev. Nora Connor. He proved himself to be one of God's best preachers and pastors. At the time of his death he was pastoring Mt. Moriah and Rocky Creek Baptist Churches. He also was a veteran of World War I. He was married to Mrs. Ollie Smith Hagins.

He is survived by: his devoted wife, Mrs. Ollie S. Hagins; one son, Mr. Rufus Hagins of Dublin; two sisters, Mrs. Elizabeth Mills and Mrs. Maxie B.
