And whispered, "Come and Rest".

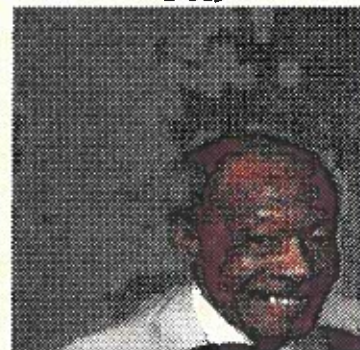
You wished no one a last farewell
