## Obituary

Deacon James Garfield Hall was born February 18, 1887 in Bulloch County, Georgia to the late Georganne Brannen Hall and Benjamin Hall, Sr.

He joined the Bethel Primitive Baptist Church in 1912 and remained a faithful member until death. He was ordained a Deacon in 1930 and was Senior Deacon of the church for a number of years.

He was united in holy matrimony in 1911 to the late Miss Elnora Lee, to this union eight children were born, all of which survive. Mrs. Elnora Lee Hall departed this life in 1932.

He later married Miss Ruth Love on August 18, 1933. She gave love and guidance to all the children and gained the respect of everyone.

He served on the Bulloch County School Board for a number of years. He was a pioneer in obtaining a school bus for the under privileged children in the county. He was also first mayor of the Willow Hill Community.

He departed this life, May 18, 1969 while attending church services.
