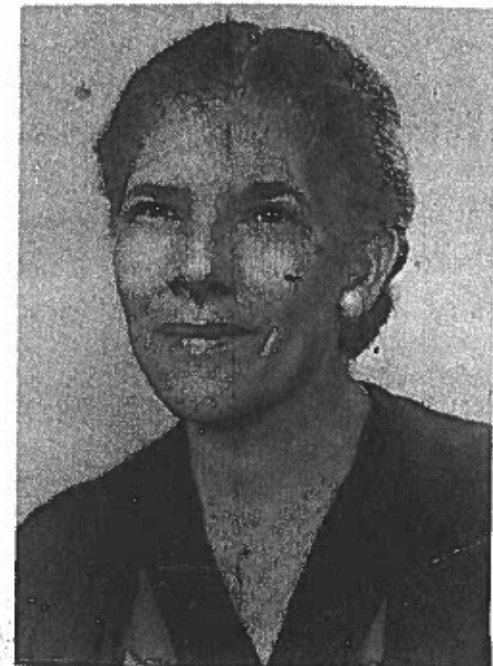
Tribute to Mother

Obituary

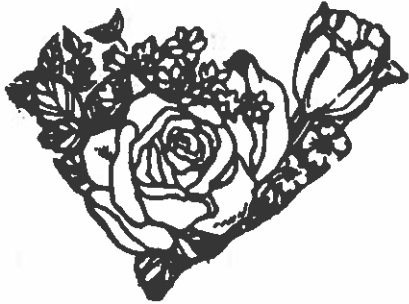
Mrs. Bonnie Love Hendley, rich in friends, and beloved by many has transferred her citizenry from the cities of this earth to the city whose builder and maker is God.
