I will protect and maintain the rights of the states, and vigorously oppose any encroachment of the federal government upon the rights of the states.
7. GOVERNOR'S PROGRAM—I will work in harmony and cooperation with whomever the people elect as governor, in his programs which are for the best interest of the people of Georgia.
8. PROGRESS—I will work for continued progress for all Georgians; for fullest development of our natural resources; for expansion and growth of both industry and agriculture; for development of our ports and waterways facilities; for greater educational opportunities.
9. LEGISLATIVE INDEPENDENCE—I will work to restore to the legislative branch its proper role in the management of our state government. Specifically, I propose that the General Assembly take a stronger hand in the allocation and appropriation of the tax money for the operation of the state government, by giving the appropriations committees trained personnel to examine operations and fiscal practices and needs of all departments of the state government. This will help bring efficiency and economy.
10. PRESIDING OVER THE SENATE—As president of the Senate, I will preside with dignity and fairness to all. I will provide full and fair hearing for all legislation submitted. I will oppose any legislation which is punitive or restrictive toward any segment or phase of our economy, or which infringes upon the basic freedoms guaranteed by our Constitution. Public business on all levels is of concern to the public and should be transacted in public. Rights and privileges of the news media should not be restricted, abridged, or curtailed.

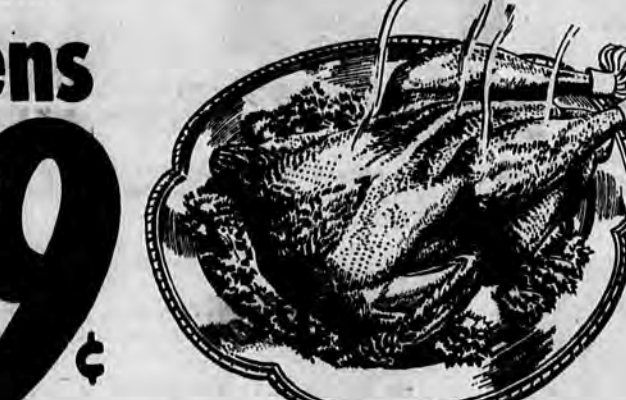

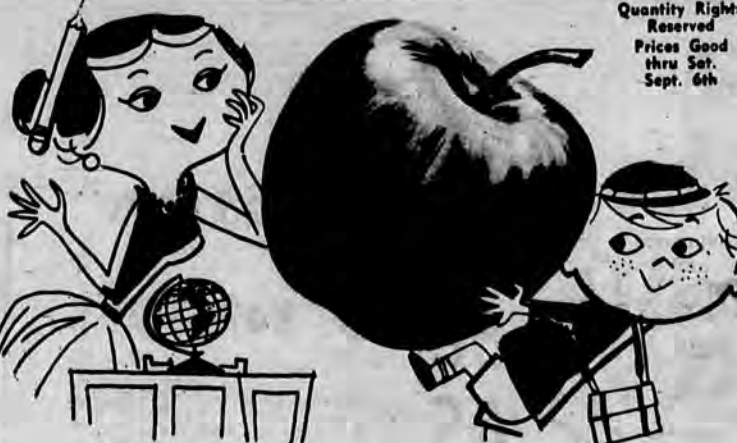
