**SMALL GRAINS**

Here are five important things to remember when planting small grains:

1. Fertilize according to soil test recommendations whenever possible.
2. Plant certified seed of a recommended variety.
3. Practice rotation. Avoid planting the same small grain in a rotation more often than once in three years.
4. Treat small grain with Ceresan M, Ceresan 75, Ceresan 100, Panogen for control of seed borne diseases.
5. For loose smut of barley and wheat use hot water treatment on limited amount for seed production.

**GULLING GUIDE**

To call or not to call off is a difficult question for dairymen to answer. Here is a gulling guide taken from the 1958 "Dairy Producer Highlights" which you dairymen may find helpful.

1. If she is a first calf heifer did she produce 30 percent below your herd average?
2. In the first four months of her lactation has she produced less than 130 pounds of butterfat?
3. Is her 305-day M. E. lactation record below the average of herd mates freshening during the same year and season?
4. Will she be dry six months or more?
5. Is there a replacement heifer available?
6. Is she an old cow?
7. Does she have a record of mastitis?
8. Is she positive to Bang's disease test?
9. Does she have a record of breeding troubles?
10. Did she have complications after last calving?
11. Does she have a record of milk fever?
12. Is the price of beef average to good?
13. Is she below the average type of your herd?
14. Is she a slow milker?
15. Will it pay you to remove this cow without replacing her?

Check these questions Yes or No for cows under consideration for culling. Each Yes answer indicates culling. If several cows are being considered, check off each cow and then compare.

Resolution Act No. 149 House Resolution No. 435-10718

**A Resolution**

Proposing an amendment to the Constitution so as to authorize taxation for the purpose of paying pensions and other benefits and costs under an ordinary retirement system; to provide for the submission of this amendment for ratification or rejection; and for other purposes.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

**SECTION 1**

Article VII, Section II of the Constitution, relating to purposes and method of taxation, is hereby amended by adding at the end thereof a new paragraph to be known as Paragraph VI, to read as follows:

"Paragraph VI. The powers of taxation may be exercised by the State through the General Assembly, and the counties, for the purpose of paying pensions and other benefits and costs under an ordinary retirement system of Georgia. The taxes so levied may be collected by such ordinary retirement system or agents or officials designated by the legislature and disbursed by said system by authority of the General Assembly for the purposes herein authorized."

**SECTION 2**

When the above proposed amendment to the Constitution shall have been agreed to by two-thirds of the members elected to each of the two branches of the General Assembly, and the same has been entered on their journals with the "Ayes" and "Nays" taken thereon, such proposed amendment shall be published

### SOIL TESTING GIVES THE ANSWER TO SOIL NEEDS

The Georgia Experiment Station, located in the principal soil areas of the state, have established a new service which will give the farmer a complete fertilizer ratio-grade recommendation for all our crops, according to County Agent Roy Powell.

Since Bulloch County soils vary considerably as to sand, silt, and clay content and from past fertility treatment and management, it is logical to assume that different soils need varying treatments for maximum response of our principal crops.

For Bulloch County the recommendation calls for three basic phosphate-potash ratios. These are high phosphate-low potash ratio like 6-12-6, low phosphate-high
