





olution Act No. 149 se Resolution No. 435-1071

IN DRY CLEANING A Resolution Proposing an amendment to the Constitution so as to authorize taxation for the purpose of paying pensions and other benefits and costs under an ordinaries retirement system; to provide for the submission of this amendment for ratification or rejection; and for other supposes.

GEORGIA:

SECTION 1

Article VII, Section II of the Constitution, relating to purposes and method of taxation, is hereby amended by adding at the end thereof a new paragraph, to be known as Paragraph VI, to read as follows:

"Paragraph VI. The powers of taxation may be exercised by the State through the General Assembly, and the counties, for the purpose of paying pensions and other benefits and costs under an ordinaries retirement system of Georgia. The taxes so levied may be collected by such ordinaries pension system or agents or officials designated by the legislature and diabursed by asid system by authority of the General Assembly for the purposes herein authorized."




