Soil reds lime, a good time to apply it is in the fall or winter.

Sources of sprigs should be determined so that time will be saved next spring. One of the best ways to have good planting stock is to establish a small nursery on the farm.

Coastal Bermuda does best when planted on well prepared soil in spring because moisture conditions are more, favorable then. Prepare the land and wait for a rain. Plant immediately when the ground is very moist.

Planting in rows and cultivating to control crabgrass and weeds is best. Sprigs should be spaced no farther apart that three feet in the row.

One of the best ways to get a stand is to drop the sprigs at the desired intervals and push them into the soil with a stick in the same manner as planting sweet potatoes. Another 'method is to drop the sprigs in a shallow furrow, cover and firm by rolling. There are a number of mechanical planters used with success when properly operated.


