"PACKERS AND STOCKYARD ACT, 1921, AS AMENDED TITLE III-STOCKYARDS

Sec. 312 (a)—It shall be unlawful for any stockyard owner, market agency, or dealer to engage in or use any unfair, unjustly discriminatory, or deceptive practice or device in connection with the receiving, marketing, buying, or selling on a com-mission basis or otherwise, feeding, watering, holding, delivery, shipment, weigh-ing or handling, in commerce, of liveatock."

Also quoting from a letter dated April 29, 1959, from Mr. Donald L. Bowman, Chief, Packers and Stockyards Branch, Livestock Division, Washington, D. C.:

"The Department has consistently taken the position that any system of guaran-teeing prices by an auction market selling livestock on a commission basis is an unfair practice under the Act. This would be true on both sale days and non-sale days. The purchase price of livestock should be that price actually paid by the buyer under competitive conditions and not a fictitious price created by a market so as to solicit consignments of livestock from competing markets."

"The practice of "bushing" hogs by auction markets on sale days appears to be another method of guaranteeing prices and does not reflect the true market price condition. This practice would also be considered an unfair practice under the Act."
