Local Cotton Farmers Get Good Yield

Some good cotton yields were obtained last year, but the Georgia Crop Reporting Service made a recent report on these yields. Few people are aware that Georgia counties averaged a bale or more per acre. Bulloch County farmers averaged almost 500 pounds of cotton per acre with a gross weight of 1 bale per acre. This year's cotton prospects aren't as good as last year's. In some areas stands have been spotted. Seeding diseases damaged some fields, and heavy rains in April and May leached out a lot of nitrogen and potash. Grass and weeds have been a bigger problem than in previous years. However, with favorable weather from here out and proper insect control, we can still make a good cotton crop.



Soil-Water Conservation

Complete whole farm planning for soil and water conservation is a major objective of the Soil Conservation Service. Mr. Turner is planning and applying the necessary soil and water conservation measures on his farm. A farm pond was designed, a terrace and waterway system planned, and permanent pastures of penecola bahia and coastal bermuda planned. Crop rotations including mulch farming and grass-cropping systems are also planned to round out his program.

Mr. Joe B. Franklin's farm is located south of Statesboro on U. S. 301. He is rapidly converting his cropland to pastures of coastal bermuda, penecola bahia, and fescue and white clover. He is establishing coastal bermuda by planting in with corn. In this way he is getting a corn crop while the bermuda is getting established. His results are very good. Last fall Mr. Franklin planted fescue and ladino clover on some wet, class two land with good results. He is very pleased with his fescue and clover since it furnishes him grazing at a time when there is practically no other grazing.

Mr. Franklin is also planning a wildlife program for quail, blue-winged teal, and mallards. By planting these crops which make good food to eat at times when the quail is scarce on the farm he can keep the birds on his place.

Heavy Rains Leach Out Nitrogen

Recent heavy rains in many areas of Georgia have leached out much of the nitrogen farmers applied to crops, particularly cotton and corn.

CARING FOR LAWNS
A wide variety of fungus diseases and insects attack lawn grasses. The wet weather this spring and early summer has been especially conducive to development of lawn diseases. Most diseases can be controlled by applying fungicides such as Calcofen, Fenidaz, PMAS, Teran, Vamido 51, and Kromad. These should be used at the rates recommended on their containers. It will usually take more than one treatment, so repeat applications at regular intervals until the disease is destroyed.

SOOTY MOLD
When humidity is high, a grayish black powdery mass often appears on lawn grasses. It is caused by "sooty mold". Generally it is not serious and it usually will clear up when the weather becomes dry and hot.

1959-CROP PRICE SUPPORT
The USDA has announced that 1959-crop price support eligibility requirements are being broadened to include "badly stained or materially weathered" oats. This action in Georgia was prompted by a request from state agricultural officials. An on-farm survey conducted by the Extension Service, indicated that 71 percent of Georgia's approximately 15 million bushel production of oats was damaged from heavy rainfall.

PEANUTS
According to recent research at the Georgia Coastal Plain Experiment Station, four peanut varieties, eligible for government price support as "Runners", accounted for an estimated 55 percent of the 524,713 acres harvested in Georgia last year. The four varieties were Dixie Runner, Virginia Bunch 67, Early Runner, and Southeastern Runner.
