Mouth-To-Mouth Respiration

The American Red Cross has made it official—
the best way to save a drowning victim is by use of the "mouth-to-mouth" system.

The system is rather simple, and it is a wonder it had not been discovered before now. The first thing to do with a victim is to tilt the head backward. The mouth should be opened, and the base of the tongue should be moved away from the back of the throat, and any obstruction in the mouth removed.

Then, the rescuer opens his mouth as wide as possible and places it tightly over the victim's mouth, pinching the victim's nostrills closed, and blows into the lungs at the rate of about once every five seconds—for an adult.

For a child, one blows a little less hard every three seconds.






