Meat-Type Hogs

Within the last few years, we have heard a lot about Meat-Type Hogs, and there is still much confusion among producers as to what the term really means.

Use Only The Best Hybrid Seed Corn

(By Roy Powell, County Agent)
It doesn't pay to go to the crib and use second generation hybrid corn seed. That's what the results of recent tests at the College Experiment Stations at Athens show.



The first generation corn had 88 percent erect plants; whereas, the second generation had only 88

per cent erect. Ears of the first generation corn were also heavier. They weighed 42 pounds per 100 ears, but the second generation weighed only 32 pounds per 100 ears.

Extension engineers say methods of harvesting and curing bright leaf tobacco are likely to go through some major changes within a few years.

HYBRID COTTON
Hybrid vigor has been used in corn for about 30 years and more recently it is being used in hybrid sorghum, Coastal Bermuda, onions and other vegetables.

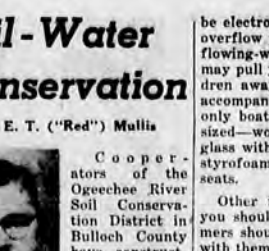

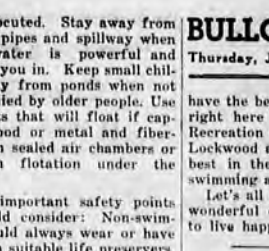
Soil-Water Conservation
