Plastic Bag Safety Rules

NEW YORK—At a recent meeting held here to warn the public about the potential dangers from mis-use of wearable ultra-thin plastic bags, the bag's safety rules were set as the greatest source of death resulting from suffocation by plastic bags.

Dr. James L. Goddard, left, head of the Accident Prevention Bureau, U. S. Department of Health, Education, and Welfare, said his department's findings showed the mis-use of ultra-thin disposable plastic bags as makeshift coverings in cribs, play pens, etc., was the principal cause of suffocation attributed to plastics.
