Prince Preston Succumbs: Funeral Held Last Friday

The First District and all of Georgia was shocked last Wednesday at the news of the untimely death of Former Congressman Prince H. Preston, Jr. who died at 3:00 p. m. on that date at Memorial Hospital in Savannah. He was 52. Stricken with cancer, Mr. Preston entered the hospital on January 1 and had been in serious condition for several weeks.

Two years ago Mr. Preston underwent radiation treatment at Walter Reed Army Hospital in Washington following the removal of a malignant tumor from his home heaves affected a coronary thrombosis and just last November he was stricken with another mild attack while driving from his home in Staterboro to Savannah on Thanksgiving Day.

A veteran of fourteen years representing the Pirst Congressional District of Georgia, Mr. Preston was defeated in last Septembers Democratic primary as he sought his eighth consecutive term in Congress. Although he received more popular votes than Elliott Hagan of Sylvania, the latter took the election in the county unit vote by a margin of 26 to 18 in a race that saw the recount of votes of Chatham county.


