Spent Your Vacation Dollar Wisely

As the primary vacation season of the year approaches, you might keep in mind the fact that it is possible to get something for your vacation dollar. It is also possible to be bled by those who would take advantage of the once-a-year vacationer.

One of the simple and amazing mistakes some people make is to start out on a vacation without advance reservations at the point of their destination. When they get there, they are at the mercy of the situation which exists, and as a result, many of them spend more money than they should.

Many of the winter vacation playgrounds of the rich are available to all of us during the primary vacation period of America — the summer.

Worse Than Wild Indians

On the Old Frontier when communities grew, the people living in them took care of the problem of "area development." No one figured that the federal government should be responsible for planning and risk-taking necessary to open up a continent and build a nation.

Some good-sized swarms blowing in the wind indicate times are now quite different with many people busy cutting up the pie bled by our self-supporting ancestors.

About a year ago Congress approved the so-called Area Development Program to promote new industry and provide jobs in "depressed areas," although there probably are few areas as depressed they cannot help themselves. But this doesn't discourage political planners.

Government agencies and programs, once started, just grow regardless of need. The Rural Electrification Administration is a case in point. The job of bringing electric service to rural areas is 98 per cent complete — thanks to investor-owned power companies cooperating with REA.

We suggest that all those who like swimming, sunbathing, etc., take advantage of the bargains which are being offered by hotels and motels in the southern climates.

If your vacation is to be spent in the mountains, investigate the government parks, which offer facilities at surprisingly reasonable prices. A little advance planning will save you a lot of money. The only other piece of advice we have for prospective vacationers is to start in time, so that they will not have to hurry. It is shocking how many vacations end up in death for the vacationer — death on the highways, where about 15,000 Americans are slaughtered each year, and well over 100,000 seriously injured.

But those who administer the REA are in no mood to make financial arrangements for their agency. So REA has started its own Rural Area Development program — RAD — not to be confused with the Area Development Program passed by Congress. Since nearly everyone has electric power and telephones, REA is now making one-cent loans to corporations for loans to patrons in other lines of business using electricity — and this can include almost anything from a winter resort to a housing development.

We must look to our affairs or we will find our future being organized by federal planners, and the businesses on America's main streets — banks, stores and newspapers too — being preserved by the unbearable competition of big government-owned and subsidized federal projects.

The Old Frontier had its drawbacks and its wild Indians, but it had a climate that was a lot healthier for a great and growing nation, and a free and independent people.

Should a preservative be added to grasses for silage? Yes. Results show that 100-200 pounds of ground-snapped corn or citrus pulp should be added to a ton of grass.

Should a trench silo be covered? Yes. Studies show that about ten pounds of dry matter is lost per acre foot of surface area if the trench silo is not covered.

President Aderhold continues, "The people of Georgia and the officials of our state must make a decision regarding the future of their state university. I do not believe that the people of Georgia and their leaders will permit mediocre support of our state university at a time when superior programs of teaching, research, and extension are vital to our survival."

Georgia Farm Bureau Scholarship Fund Increased
Georgia Farm Bureau's College Scholarship program fund has been increased from \$1,000 to \$2,000 effective in 1962, and the deadline for rural student entry is May 30.

Rural boys and girls desiring to study agriculture or home economics in the University of Georgia system or Berry College may apply for a scholarship. The recipient's check will be deposited to his credit with the University or Berry College. The funds will be divided quarterly into payments against tuition and other expenses.

In addition to meeting other requirements the applicant must be qualified to enter college the fall term of the current year. The Georgia Farm Bureau Scholarship Fund applications may be obtained from County Farm Bureau presidents, county and home demonstration agents, county men, county Farm Bureau office secretaries or from the secretary-treasurer of the local Farm Bureau unit.

Employment opportunities for rural youth with agricultural college training is at a rate twice the level of such students graduating from the nation's college. More college trained youth graduating from the University College of Agriculture and Berry College, including home economics majors are returning to the farms of Georgia, but a still greater gap exists in filling the farm-aided industrial needs of agricultural graduates with farm background.
